**1050 (XXXVII). Discontinuance of the Commission on International  
Commodity Trade**

*The Economic and Social Council,*

*Taking note of recommendation A.V.1 of the Final Act of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development<sup>1</sup> and of General Assembly resolution 1995 (XIX) of 30 December 1964,*

1. *Decides to discontinue the Commission on International Commodity Trade;*
2. *Agrees to transfer the functions of the Commission to the Committee on Commodities of the Trade and Development Board of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development.*

## OTHER DECISIONS TAKEN BY THE COUNCIL DURING ITS RESUMED THIRTY-SEVENTH SESSION

### Basic programme of the Council for 1965

At its 1353rd and 1354th meetings, held on 1 and 8 March 1965 respectively, the Council approved its basic programme for 1965 and considered the provisional agenda for its thirty-eighth session. The Council decided to request the Secretariat to establish, after consultation with members of the Council and with the specialized agencies, the dates of the opening of the debates on the items allocated to the thirty-eighth session.

### Adjustments in the Calendar of Conferences for 1965

At its 1352nd and 1353rd meetings on 1 March 1965, the Council decided:

(a) To convene the Technical Assistance Committee in Geneva from 14 to 25 June 1965;<sup>2</sup>

(b) To convene the Committee on Housing, Building and Planning in New York from 7 to 20 September 1965;

(c) To convene the third session of the Advisory Committee on the Application of Science and Technology to Development from 31 March to 9 April 1965 at UNESCO House, Paris;

(d) To take note of the financial considerations pertaining to the holding of the fourth session of the Advisory Committee on the Application of Science and Technology to Development;<sup>3</sup>

(e) To postpone the opening of the thirty-eighth session from 15 to 22 March 1965.

### Election of nine members of the sessional committees of the Council

At its 1353rd meeting on 1 March 1965, the Council elected the following States members of the Economic Committee, the Social Committee and the Committee on Co-ordination to serve for the calendar year of 1965: CAMEROON, DENMARK, GHANA, INDIA, IRAN, MADAGASCAR, MEXICO, UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC and the UNITED REPUBLIC OF TANZANIA.

### Election of seven members of the Technical Assistance Committee

NIGERIA, POLAND, SWITZERLAND and the UNITED ARAB REPUBLIC. In addition the Council elected NEW ZEALAND, a non-member of the Council, to serve for the remainder of the term of office of Canada, until 31 December 1965, since Canada had been elected to membership on the Council.

**Election of five members of the Committee for Industrial Development**

At its 1354th meeting, on 8 March 1965, the Council elected the following States members of the Committee for Industrial Development to serve from 1 January 1965 for a term of office of three years: GREECE, KUWAIT, MEXICO, MOROCCO. In addition the Council elected TURKEY, a non-member of the Council, to serve for the remainder of the term of office of Pakistan, until 31 December 1966, since Pakistan had been elected to membership on the Council.

**Election of members of the Council Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations**

At its 1354th meeting, on 8 March 1965, the Council elected the following States members of the Council Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations to serve for the calendar year of 1965: AUSTRIA, CHILE, FRANCE, GABON, UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS, UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND and the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

**Postponement of the election of the members of the Special Committee on Co-ordination**

At its 1354th meeting, on 8 March 1965, the Council decided to postpone to its thirty-eighth session the election of the eleven members of the Special Committee on Co-ordination.
