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SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC COOPERATION:
IMPLEMENTATION AND FOLLOW-UP TO MAJOR CONSENSUS AGREEMENTS ON
DEVELOPMENT

Report of the Second Committee (Part II)*

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Second Committee held a substantive debate on agenda item 96 (see A/51/604, para. 2). Action on sub-item (a) was taken at the 27th and 36th meetings, on 6 and 25 November 1996. An account of the Committee's consideration of the sub-item is contained in the relevant summary records (A/C.2/51/SR.27 and 36).

II. CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT RESOLUTIONS A/C.2/51/L.13 and L.32

2. At the 27th meeting, on 6 November, the representative of Costa Rica, on behalf of the States Members that are members of the Group of 77 and China, introduced a draft resolution (A/C.2/51/L.13) entitled "Implementation of the commitments and policies agreed upon in the Declaration on International Economic Cooperation, in particular the Revitalization of Economic Growth and Development of the Developing Countries, and implementation of the International Development Strategy for the Fourth United Nations Development Decade", which read:

"The General Assembly,

"Reaffirming the importance and continued validity of the Declaration on International Economic Cooperation, in particular the Revitalization of Economic Growth and Development of the Developing Countries, contained in the annex to its resolution S-18/3 of 1 May 1990, and the International Development Strategy for the Fourth United Nations Development Decade, contained in the annex to its resolution 45/199 of 21 December 1990,

"Recalling its resolutions 46/144 of 17 December 1991, 47/152 of 18 December 1992, 48/185 of 21 December 1993 and 49/92 of 19 December 1994 on the implementation of the Declaration and the Strategy,

"Aware that the Declaration, the Strategy and the agenda for development are mutually supportive and closely interlinked in promoting sustained economic growth and sustainable development in the developing countries,

"1. Takes note of the report submitted by the Secretary-General on the Implementation of the Declaration on International Economic Cooperation, in particular the Revitalization of Economic Growth and Development of the Developing Countries and the International Development Strategy for the Fourth United Nations Development Decade;

"2. Recognizes the need to strengthen the implementation of the Declaration and the Strategy in the remaining years of the 1990s to ensure that the decade will indeed be one of accelerated development in the developing countries and strengthened international economic cooperation;

"3. Emphasizes the need to identify those commitments and agreements that are not fully implemented and the constraints to implementation, and recognizes, in this context, the need to address, as a matter of priority, the issues of flow of resources, debt, trade and market access for developing countries, and their effective participation in international economic decision-making;

"4. Recognizes the need to provide particular support to those least developed countries suffering a deteriorating economic situation;

"5. Encourages Member States that have not yet submitted their reports on the implementation of the commitments and policies agreed upon in the Declaration and the Strategy to do so;

"6. Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly at its fifty-third session a progress report on the implementation of the Declaration and the Strategy, with particular emphasis on the relationship of the Declaration and the Strategy and their impact on development trends, and emerging experiences with and consensus on development strategies;

"7. Calls for the review and appraisal of the Declaration and the Strategy to be coordinated with the follow-up work of the major United Nations conferences as well as the agenda for development."

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3. At the 36th meeting, on 25 November, the Vice-Chairman of the Committee, Mr. Mohammad Reza Hadji Karim Djabbari (Islamic Republic of Iran), introduced a draft resolution (A/C.2/51/L.32), submitted on the basis of informal consultations held on draft resolution A/C.2/51/L.13.
4. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.2/51/L.32 (see para. 7).
5. After the adoption of the draft resolution, the representative of the United States of America made a statement (see A/C.2/51/SR.36).
6. In the light of the adoption of draft resolution A/C.2/51/L.32, draft resolution A/C.2/51/L.13 was withdrawn by its sponsors.

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE SECOND COMMITTEE

7. The Second Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Implementation of the commitments and policies agreed upon
in the Declaration on International Economic Cooperation,
in particular the Revitalization of Economic Growth and
Development of the Developing Countries, and implementation
of the International Development Strategy for the Fourth
United Nations Development Decade

The General Assembly,

Reaffirming the importance and continued validity of the Declaration on International Economic Cooperation, in particular the Revitalization of Economic Growth and Development of the Developing Countries, contained in the annex to its resolution S-18/3 of 1 May 1990, and the International Development Strategy for the Fourth United Nations Development Decade, contained in the annex to its resolution 45/199 of 21 December 1990,

Recalling its resolutions 46/144 of 17 December 1991, 47/152 of 18 December 1992, 48/185 of 21 December 1993 and 49/92 of 19 December 1994 on the implementation of the Declaration and the Strategy,

Aware that the Declaration, the Strategy and the ongoing discussion on an agenda for development are mutually supportive and closely interlinked,

1. Takes note of the report of the Secretary-General on the implementation of the Declaration on International Economic Cooperation, in particular the Revitalization of Economic Growth and Development of the Developing Countries and the International Development Strategy for the Fourth United Nations Development Decade;¹

2. Recognizes the need to strengthen the implementation of the Declaration and the Strategy in the remaining years of the 1990s so as to ensure that the Decade will indeed be one of accelerated development, in particular in the developing countries, and strengthened international economic cooperation;

3. Calls upon Member States to identify and take follow-up actions on those commitments and agreements that are not fully implemented and on the constraints to implementation;

4. Recognizes the need to provide particular support to those least developed countries suffering from a deteriorating economic situation;

5. Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly at its fifty-third session a progress report on the implementation of the Declaration and the Strategy, with particular emphasis on their relationship with and impact on development trends, and on emerging experiences with and consensus on development strategies;

6. Encourages Member States to provide, as and when available, reports and papers relevant to the implementation of the commitments and policies agreed upon in the Declaration and the Strategy in order to assist the Secretary-General in preparing the report called for above;

7. Calls for the review and appraisal of the Declaration and the Strategy to be coordinated with the follow-up work on major United Nations conferences and the ongoing discussion on an agenda for development.
