NOTE VERBALE DATED 12 DECEMBER 1996 FROM THE UNITED STATES MISSION
TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The United States Mission to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour, in conformity with paragraph 6 of Security Council resolution 1054 (1996) of 26 April 1996, to inform him of additional measures taken by the United States to implement the provisions of paragraph 3 of the resolution.

On 2 July, the United States Mission to the United Nations had the honour to inform you of measures taken pursuant to resolution 1054 (1996) (S/1996/530) and noted that the Government of the United States was preparing to change its regulation concerning entry visas for officials of the Sudanese Government or armed forces. On 22 November 1996, in the light of the refusal of the Government of the Sudan to comply with Security Council resolution 1044 (1996) of 31 January 1996, and in furtherance of Security Council resolution 1054 (1996), President Clinton signed a proclamation suspending the entry as immigrants and non-immigrants of persons who are members or officials of the Sudanese Government or armed forces. The proclamation does not restrict the entry of Sudanese officials coming to the United States on official business of the United Nations other than in a manner consistent with the obligations of the United States to the United Nations.
