SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1996/15 of 11 January 1996, S/1996/15/Add.4 of 9 February 1996, S/1996/15/Add.8 of 8 March 1996, S/1996/15/Add.14 of 19 April 1996, S/1996/15/Add.18 of 17 May 1996, S/1996/15/Add.32 of 23 August 1996 and S/1996/15/Add.41 of 25 October 1996.

During the week ending 26 October 1996, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation in Afghanistan (see S/1994/20/Add.3, S/1994/20/Add.11, S/1994/20/Add.31, S/1994/20/Add.47, S/1996/15/Add.6, S/1996/15/Add.14, S/1996/15/Add.38 and S/1996/15/Add.41; see also S/19420/Add.44, S/20370/Add.14, S/20370/Add.15, S/20370/Add.16 and S/21100/Add.1)

The Security Council continued its consideration of the item, which had started at its 3705th meeting, on 16 October 1996, at the 3706th meeting, held on 22 October 1996.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1996/865) which had been submitted by France, Germany, Italy, Kazakstan, Kyrgyzstan, the Republic of Korea, the Russian Federation, Tajikistan, the United States of America and Uzbekistan and made oral revisions to the text of the draft resolution in its provisional form.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1996/865, as orally revised in its provisional form, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1076 (1996) (for the text, see S/RES/1076 (1996); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-first Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1996).

The situation in Georgia (see S/23370/Add.40, S/25070/Add.4, S/25070/Add.26, S/25070/Add.27, S/25070/Add.31, S/25070/Add.34, S/25070/Add.37, S/25070/Add.42, S/25070/Add.44, S/25070/Add.45, S/25070/Add.51, S/1994/20/Add.4, S/1994/20/Add.8, S/1994/20/Add.9, S/1994/20/Add.11, S/1994/20/Add.13, S/1994/20/Add.25, S/1994/20/Add.28, S/1994/20/Add.47, S/1995/40/Add.1, S/1995/40/Add.10, S/1995/40/Add.18, S/1995/40/Add.32, S/1996/15/Add.1, S/1996/15/Add.16 and S/1996/15/Add.27)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3707th meeting, held on 22 October 1996, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General pursuant to Security Council resolution 1065 (1996) (S/1996/644) and the report of the Secretary-General concerning the situation in Abkhazia, Georgia (S/1996/843).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Georgia, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1996/866) which had been submitted by France, Germany, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1996/866 which received 14 votes in favour, and none against, with one abstention (China), and was adopted as resolution 1077 (1996) (for the text, see S/RES/1077 (1996); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-first Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1996).

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/1996/43; to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-first Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1996).
