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SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1996/15 of 11 January 1996, S/1996/15/Add.4 of 9 February 1996, S/1996/15/Add.8 of 8 March 1996, S/1996/15/Add.14 of 19 April 1996 S/1996/15/Add.18 of 17 May 1996, S/1996/15/Add.32 of 23 August 1996, S/1996/15/Add.41 of 25 October 1996 and S/1996/15/Add.43 of 8 November 1996.

During the week ending 16 November 1996, the Security Council met at its 3711th meeting, held on 13 November 1996, to consider its draft report to the General Assembly covering the period from 16 June 1995 to 15 June 1996.

The Security Council adopted the draft report without a vote, and the decision was reflected in a note by the President of the Council (S/1996/935).

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The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3712th meeting, held on 15 November 1996, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Transitional Administration for Eastern Slavonia, Baranja and Western Sirmium (S/1996/883).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Croatia, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1996/938) which had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1996/938 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1079 (1996) (for the text, see S/RES/1079 (1996); to be issued in <u>Official Records of the Security Council</u>, Fifty-first Year, Resolutions and <u>Decisions of the Security Council</u>, 1996).

The situation in the Great Lakes region (see S/1996/15/Add.43 and S/1996/15/Add.44)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3713th meeting, held on 15 November 1996, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the letter dated 14 November 1996 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1996/941).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Argentina, Austria, Belgium, Burundi, Cameroon, Canada, the Congo, Denmark, Finland, Gabon, Ireland, Israel, Luxembourg, Mali, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Rwanda, Spain, Sweden and Zaire, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1996/943), which had been submitted by Belgium, Botswana, Canada, Chile, Denmark, Egypt, France, Gabon, Germany, Guinea-Bissau, Honduras, Indonesia, Ireland, Italy, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, the Republic of Korea, Spain, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America and Zaire. The President announced that Argentina, Austria, Cameroon, the Congo, Finland, Israel, Luxembourg, Mali and Sweden had joined in sponsoring draft resolution S/1996/943.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1996/943 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1080 (1996) (for the text, see S/RES/1080 (1996); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-first Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1996).

Subsequently, the President drew attention to a letter dated 15 November 1996 from the Permanent Representative of Brazil to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1996/949), which stated that it had been the intention of Brazil to be a sponsor of draft resolution S/1996/943.
