Statement issued on 23 January 1997 by the Presidency on behalf of the European Union on Nicaragua

The European Union welcomes the conduct of the elections in Nicaragua resulting in the formation of the new Government, headed by Mr. Arnaldo Aleman, which took office on 10 January.

In these circumstances, the outcome of the elections must be respected by all of Nicaragua's political forces.

The European Union is aware of the challenge ahead for Nicaragua's new administration, which faces an extensive programme of social and economic reforms, already embarked on by the Government of Mrs. Chamorro, that is only achievable with the consensus of the political groups and with parliamentary agreement between the party in Government and the opposition.

In this connection, the European Union welcomes the recent meeting between the President and the opposition leader, Mr. Ortega, and hopes that this will be the first step in establishing constructive cooperation towards the consolidation of democracy, economic reform and social development in Nicaragua.

The countries members of the European Free Trade Association within the European Economic Area, the Central and Eastern European countries associated with the European Union and the associated country, Cyprus, align themselves with this declaration.
