Statement issued on 31 January 1997 by the Presidency of
the European Union on the elections in Chechnya

The European Union welcomes the way the presidential and parliamentary elections in the Russian republic of Chechnya were conducted. The elections represent the free will of the voters and form a legitimate base for the new authorities. The European Union expresses the sincere hope that the election results will contribute to establishing the necessary democratic framework within which progress can be made towards a comprehensive solution of the conflict. The European Union highly appreciates the contribution made by the mission of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe in Grozny to the organization and monitoring of the elections.

Bulgaria, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Romania and Slovakia, align themselves with this statement.
