LETTER DATED 11 FEBRUARY 1997 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to Security Council resolution 1094 (1997) of 20 January 1997, by which the Council authorized, for a three-month period, the attachment to the United Nations Mission for the Verification of Human Rights and of Compliance with the Commitments of the Comprehensive Agreement on Human Rights in Guatemala (MINUGUA) of a group of 155 military observers and requisite medical personnel.

Having completed the necessary consultations, I propose that the group be composed of personnel from the following Member States: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Brazil, Canada, Ecuador, Germany, India, Norway, the Russian Federation, Singapore, Spain, Sweden, Ukraine, the United States of America, Uruguay and Venezuela.

All of these States have expressed their readiness to make the necessary personnel available. I shall revert to the Security Council should the need arise to amend the list of contributors.

I should be grateful if you would bring these matters to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
