SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/1997/40 of 10 January 1997.

During the week ending 25 January 1997, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Central America: efforts towards peace (see S/20370/Add.29 and 44; S/21100/Add.12, 15, 17, 20, 22 and 44; S/22110/Add.18, 20, 39 and 44; S/23370/Add.2, 43 and 48; S/25070/Add.6, 11, 21, 23, 44 and 48; S/1994/20/Add.13, 20, 36 and 46; S/1995/40/Add.16; and S/1997/40/Add.1)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3732nd meeting, held on 20 January 1997 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on Central America: efforts towards peace (S/1996/1045 and Add.1 and 2).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Guatemala, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/49) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/49, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1094 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1094 (1997); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).
