#### ORGANIZATION OF THE SESSION

#### A. Opening and duration of the session

1. The Commission for Social Development held its thirty-fifth session at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 25 February to 6 March 1997. The Commission held \_\_\_\_ meetings (1st to \_\_\_\_ ) and a number of informal meetings.

#### B. Attendance

2. In accordance with Economic and Social Council resolution 1996/7 of 22 July 1996, the Commission is composed of 46 States Members of the United Nations, elected on the principle of equitable geographical distribution.

6. At its 3rd meeting, on 26 February 1997, the Commission elected Mr. Santiago Apunte Franco as Vice-Chairman cum Rapporteur by acclamation.

7. At its 4th meeting, on 26 February 1997, the Commission elected Mr. Ahmed Abdel Halim (Sudan) as Vice-Chairman by acclamation.

8. At its 1st meeting, on 25 February, the Commission adopted its provisional agenda for the session contained in document E/CN.5/1997/1 (see annex \_\_\_\_ to the present report).

E. Organization of work

9. At the same meeting, the Commission approved its organization of work of the session (see E/CN.5/1997/L.1), as orally amended.

F. Opening statements

10. At its 1st meeting, on 25 February, the Commission heard an opening statement by the temporary Chairman, Mr. Koos Richelle (Netherlands).

11. At the same meeting, the Commission heard a statement by the Under-Secretary-General for Policy Coordination and Sustainable Development of the United Nations Secretariat.

G. Appointment of the chairmen of the working groups

At its 3rd meeting, on 26 February, the Commission endorsed the appointment of Mrs. Julia Tavares de Alvarez (Dominican Republic) and Mr. Aurelio Fernandez (Spain) as co-chairpersons of the in-session Working Group on the Fourth Review and Appraisal of the Implementation of the International Plan of Action on Ageing and Preparations for the International Year of Older Persons.
