1. Opening of the session

The session will be opened by the Chairman of the Committee on Information.

2. <u>Election of officers</u>

At its organizational session in 1980, the Committee on Information reached an agreement according to which the principle of geographical rotation would be applied to all officers of the Committee and they would be elected for two-year terms. 1 At the beginning of the nineteenth session, the Committee will elect a Chairman, three Vice-Chairmen and a Rapporteur to serve in their respective capacities during 1997 and 1998.

3. Adoption of the agenda and programme of work

The provisional agenda has been prepared on the basis of consultations among the members of the outgoing Bureau.

4. Statement by the Chairman

The Chairman will address the Committee at its opening meeting.

5. Statement by the Assistant Secretary-General
