<u>Addendum</u>

1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignation of Mr. Andre Xavier Pirson (Belgium) as a member of the International Civil Service Commission. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required at its current session to appoint a person to fill the unexpired portion of the term of office of Mr. Pirson, that is, until 31 December 1998.

2. The Government of Germany has nominated Mr. Wolfgang Stöckl to fill this vacancy.
