SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1997/40 of 10 January 1997 and S/1997/40/Add.10 of 21 March 1997.

During the week ending 29 March 1997, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation in Liberia (see S/22110/Add.3 and Corr.1; S/23370/Add.18 and 46; S/25070/Add.12, 23, 32 and 38; S/1994/20/Add.15, 20, 27, 36 and 41; S/1995/40/Add.1, 14, 25, 36 and 44; and S/1996/15/Add.3, 4, 14, 18, 21, 34 and 47)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3757th meeting, held on 27 March 1997 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the twenty-second progress report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Observer Mission in Liberia (S/1997/237).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Liberia and the Netherlands, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/254) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/254 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1100 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1100 (1997); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).

The situation in Albania (see S/1997/40/Add.10)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3758th meeting, held on 28 March 1997 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the letter dated 28 March 1997 from the Permanent Representative of Albania to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1997/259).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Albania, Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, the Netherlands, Romania, Spain, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Turkey, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/260), which had been submitted by Albania, Austria, Belgium, France, Greece, Italy, Poland, Portugal, the Republic of Korea, Romania, Spain, Sweden, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America, joined by Denmark, Finland, Germany, Ireland and the Netherlands, and made oral revisions to the text of the draft resolution in its provisional form.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/260, as orally revised in its provisional form. The draft resolution received 14 votes in favour to none against, with 1 abstention (China) and was adopted as resolution 1101 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1101 (1997); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).

The situation in Angola (see S/25070/Add.4, 10, 17, 22, 23, 28, 37, 44 and 50; S/1994/20/Add.5, 10, 21, 25, 31, 35, 38, 42, 43 and 48; S/1995/40/Add.5, 9, 14, 18, 31, 40 and 50; S/1996/15/Add.5, 16, 18, 27, 40 and 49; and S/1997/40/Add.4, 8 and 11; see also S/19420/Add.51; S/22110/Add.21; and S/23370/Add.12, 27, 37, 40, 43, 48 and 51)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3759th meeting, held on 31 March 1997 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Angola Verification Mission (UNAVEM III) (S/1997/248).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Angola, at her request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/262) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/262 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1102 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1102 (1997); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/263) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/263 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1103 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1103 (1997); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).
