SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1997/40 of 10 January 1997 and S/1997/40/Add.10 of 21 March 1997.

During the week ending 5 April 1997, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Letters dated 20 and 23 December 1991 from France, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America (see S/25070/Add.45 and S/1996/15/Add.15; see also S/23370/Add.3 and 13)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3761st meeting, held on 4 April 1997 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.
