SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

<u>Addendum</u>

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1997/40 of 10 January 1997 and S/1997/40/Add.10 of 21 March 1997.

During the week ending 12 April 1997, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Establishment of an international tribunal for the prosecution of persons responsible for serious violations of international humanitarian law committed in the territory of the former Yugoslavia (see S/25070/Add.8, 21, 33 and 42; and S/1994/20/Add.26; see also S/22110/Add.38, 47 and 50; S/23370/Add.1, 5, 7, 14, 16, 19, 21, 24, 26, 28, 29, 31, 32, 35-37, 40, 43, 45, 46, 49 and 50; S/25070/Add.1, 4, 7-9, 11-13, 15-19, 22, 23, 24 and Corr.1, 26, 28-30, 32, 34, 37, 39-42 and 45; S/1994/20 and Add.4, 6, 8, 10, 12-17, 20, 21, 23, 25, 31, 34, 37, 38, 44-47 and 49; S/1995/40 and Add.1, 2, 5, 6, 12, 14-19, 23, 24, 26-32, 35-37, 39, 40, 44, 46-48 and 50; S/1996/15/Add.1, 2, 4, 6-8, 13, 18, 20, 21, 26, 28, 30-32, 37, 39, 40, 45, 47, 49 and 50; and S/1997/40/Add.2, 4, 6, 9, 10 and 11)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3763rd meeting, held on 8 April 1997, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/283), that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/283 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1104 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1104 (1997); to be issued in <u>Official Records of the Security Council</u>, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3764th meeting, held on 9 April 1997, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the letter dated 3 April 1997 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1997/276).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/290), that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/290 and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1105 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1105 (1997); to be issued in <u>Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second</u> <u>Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997</u>).
