LETTER DATED 28 MAY 1997 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Upon instructions from my Government and with reference to the letter dated 12 February 1997 (S/1997/122) from the Permanent Representative of the United Arab Emirates, I have the honour to convey the following observations regarding the Iranian islands in the Persian Gulf:

- 1. Such communications, in which the proper and correct name of the "Persian Gulf" has not been used, are unnecessary and provocative. They will not help in removing misunderstandings in a region where all littoral States should be concerned with peace, security and tranquillity.
- 2. My Government categorically rejects all allegations referred to in the above-mentioned letter and considers it as an interference in the internal affairs of the Islamic Republic of Iran and a violation of its territorial integrity.
- 3. The Islamic Republic of Iran, once again, emphasizes the need to resolve the existing misunderstandings in bilateral negotiations.

It would be highly appreciated if the present letter were circulated as a document of the Security Council.
