PROGRESS REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON THE UNITED NATIONS ANGOLA VERIFICATION MISSION (UNAVEM III)

Addendum

- 1. In reference to paragraph 52 of my report dated 5 June 1997 (S/1997/438), I wish to inform the Security Council that the cost of the follow-on mission, the United Nations Observer Mission in Angola (MONUA), is estimated at \$64.5 million for the seven-month period from 1 July 1997 to 1 February 1998.
- 2. This estimate provides for 193 military contingent personnel, 86 military observers and 345 civilian police monitors, supported by a civilian establishment of some 310 international civilian staff, 250 locally recruited staff and 60 United Nations volunteers.
- 3. A breakdown of the estimated requirements is provided for information purposes, by main categories of expenditure, in the annex to the present addendum.
- 4. It is my intention to propose to the General Assembly, should the Security Council decide to authorize the establishment of the Observer Mission, that the costs relating thereto should be considered an expense of the Organization to be borne by Member States in accordance with Article 17, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the United Nations and that the assessments to be levied on Member States should be credited to a Special Account to be established for the new mission.
