Letter dated 30 June 1997 from the Chairman of the
Special Committee on the Situation with regard to
the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting
of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples
addressed to the Secretary-General

On behalf of the Special Committee, I should like to refer to the report of the Office of Internal Oversight Services dated 11 October 1996 (A/51/486). The Fifth Committee and the General Assembly, in their decisions of 6 and 13 June 1997 (see A/51/922, para. 11), respectively took note of the aforementioned report. However, no action was taken with respect to the report on the regional seminars of the Special Committee (A/AC.109/2085), which is closely related to the report of the Office of Internal Oversight Services and clarifies some of its erroneous conclusions.

I wish to kindly draw the attention of Member States to the Special Committee's report. I also hope that before issuing future reports criticizing a major programme authorized by the General Assembly, the Office of Internal Oversight Services would first seek the views of the committee concerned and, second, avoid reaching erroneous conclusions which could damage such a noble goal as decolonization, which is one of the major achievements of the United Nations.
