Corrigendum

Paragraph 240 should read as follows:

The Government replied that Geng Danti had been arrested, in connection with the theft of a speedboat, by officers of the central harbour-master's office of Corfu, who had held him for the minimum time strictly necessary for interrogation. Neither during this initial detention nor during his subsequent temporary detention by the police did he request to be visited by a doctor, a lawyer or any other person, nor did any lawyer come to the police department. All relevant provisions relating to detention were observed and no complaint was expressed by him. On 3 November 1995, he appeared before an examining magistrate who, despite the lack of documentary evidence as to his age, assigned him, pending trial, to the juvenile prison of Volos.
