IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE DENUCLEARIZATION
OF AFRICA

Report of the Secretary-General

1. By resolution 35/146 A of 12 December 1980, entitled "Nuclear capability of South Africa", the General Assembly, having considered the report of the Secretary-General on South Africa's plan and capability in the nuclear field, including the reported explosion of a nuclear device in the South Atlantic on 22 September 1979 (A/35/402 and Corr.1), inter alia, expressed its appreciation to the Secretary-General for his report, expressed its deep alarm at South Africa's capability to manufacture nuclear weapons, called upon all States, corporations, institutions or individuals to terminate forthwith nuclear collaboration between them and the racist régime of South Africa, requested the Secretary-General to give maximum publicity to the report on South Africa's plan and capability in the nuclear field, further requested the Secretary-General to follow closely South Africa's activity in the nuclear field and to report to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session.

2. Pursuant to the above resolution, the Secretary-General has given maximum publicity to the report on South Africa's plan and capability in the nuclear field and, in co-operation with the International Atomic Energy Agency, followed closely South Africa's activities in that area. The Secretary-General has not identified any further information on South Africa's nuclear developments and therefore has nothing to add to his earlier report.
