The Permanent Mission of Turkey ... has the sad duty of reporting to the Secretary-General a specific case of serious violation of the safety of Turkish diplomatic representatives, which occurred in France in the circumstances described below:

On 4 March 1981, the Labour Counsellor to the Turkish Embassy in Paris, Mr. Reşat Morali, and his Social Assistant in charge of religious matters, Mr. Tecelli Ari, were entering Mr. Morali's car when they were the victims of an armed attack by three terrorists, just outside the Labour Counsellor's office in Boulevard Beaumarchais. The act of violence, which occurred 12.45 p.m. local time, killed Mr. Morali, while Mr. Ari died of his mortal wounds in the hospital to which he had been taken. "Asala", the so-called Armenian Secret Army for the Liberation for Armenia, has claimed responsibility for the murder.

The Permanent Mission of Turkey hopes that the French Government, on whose territory the incident occurred, will not fail to report as soon as possible to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 7 of General Assembly resolution 35/168, on the measures which it has taken to arrest and bring to justice those who committed the double murder and to prevent a repetition of such acts.
