Seminar on the Relations that Exist between Human  
Rights, Peace and Development

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In paragraph 6 of resolution 35/174 of 15 December 1980, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to give priority to holding a seminar at the Headquarters of the United Nations, within the framework of the Advisory Services Programme, on the relations that exist between human rights, peace and development. At its thirty-seventh session, the Commission on Human Rights reiterated this request in its resolution 36 (XXXVII) which the Economic and Social Council endorsed by its decision 1981/156 of 8 May 1981. The Seminar was accordingly held at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 3 to 14 August 1981.
2. The Seminar, inter alia, recommended that its report should be submitted to the General Assembly at its thirty-sixth session for its information, to the Commission on Human Rights, the Commission on the Status of Women and to the Commission on Human Rights' Working Group on the Right to Development, as well as to the Working Group of the Economic and Social Council on the Implementation of ~~the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights.~~
3. The report of the seminar (ST/HR/SER.A/10) will be made available to delegations.
