QUESTIONS RELATING TO INFORMATION

Appointment of members of the Committee to Review United Wations Public Information Policies and Activities

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. In paragraph 4 of resolution 33/115 C, of 18 December 1978, the General Assembly decided to establish the Committee to Review United Nations Public Information Policies and Activities consisting of 41 Member States and requested the President of the General Assembly, having consulted the regional groups, to appoint the members of the Committee on the basis of equitable geographical distribution.
- 2. The Secretary-General has received the following communication on the subject, dated 4 April 1979, from the President of the General Assembly:
