1. The Trade and Development Board, at its forty-third session, on 16 October 1996, approved the applications of seven non-governmental organizations for designation under rule 77 of the rules of procedure of the Board.

2. The following entries should thus be added to the list of non-governmental organizations participating in the work of UNCTAD (see document TD/B/NGO/LIST/1/Add.1 and 2):

3. Also at this session, the Board was informed that the Secretary-General of UNCTAD has included the National Centre for Overseas Development (NCOS) in the Register of national non-governmental organizations provided for under Board decision 43 (VII).

4. The Board noted that the following non-governmental organizations have changed their names: Coordination Committee for the Textile Industries in the European Economic Community (COMITEXTIL), which was granted status in the special category by the Board at the first part of its twelfth session, is now the European Apparel and Textile Organisation (EURATEX) incorporating the European Largest Textile and Apparel Companies (ELTAC) and the European Clothing Association (ECLA); the Miners' International Federation (MIF), which was granted status in the special category by the Board at its thirteenth session, has merged with the International Federation of Chemical, Energy and General Workers' Unions (ICEF) and is now the International Federation of Chemical, Energy, Mine and General Workers' Unions (ICEM); the European Association for the Trade in Jute Projects (EATJP), which was granted status in the special category by the Board at the first part of its tenth session, is now the European Association for the Trade in Jute and Related Products (EAJP); and the Association of West European Shipbuilders, which was granted status in the special category at the first part of the thirty-fourth session of the Board, is now the Association of European Shipbuilders and Shiprepairers, retaining the acronym AWES.

5. Accordingly, the number of non-governmental organizations included in the list provided for in rule 77 of the rules of procedure now totals 174: 87 in the General category and 87 in the Special category. There are now seven national non-governmental organizations included in the Register.
