QUESTION OF NAMIBIA

Letter dated 30 May 1979 from the Permanent Representative of
Hungary to the United Nations addressed to the President of
the General Assembly

I have the honour to draw attention to the numerous official statements of the People's Republic of Kampuchea, more particularly to the message dated 18 May 1979 from the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of Kampuchea addressed to you as President of the General Assembly (A/33/566, annex), in which the actual situation prevailing in the People's Republic of Kampuchea is unequivocally recalled. It is stated there that the so-called Government of "Democratic Kampuchea" is no longer in existence on Kampuchean soil and that anyone who is not appointed by the People's Revolutionary Council of that country has no right to act or speak on behalf of Kampuchea at any international forum.

The delegation of the Hungarian People's Republic to the thirty-third session of the General Assembly fully associates itself with the above indicated message of the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of Kampuchea and holds that the presence of self-proclaimed and manipulated representatives of Kampuchea at the United Nations constitutes an illegal act, is consequently null and void and damages the prestige of this world Organization.

The delegation of the Hungarian People's Republic requests to have the text of this letter circulated as an official document of the General Assembly under agenda items 3 and 27.
