Lebanese law prohibits the voluntary or compulsory enlistment of children under 18 years of age in the armed forces.

#### <u>Spain</u>

[Original: Spanish]
[11 December 1996]

- 1. Spain supports resolution 1996/85 and the preparation of the draft protocols on the involvement of children in armed conflicts and on the sale of children, child prostitution and child pornography.
- 2. As to the first of the two draft protocols, Spain's policy has been to support an age limit of 18 years, at least for participation in hostilities or taking part in armed conflicts. Alternatively it could support voluntary enlistment below this age limit provided that the children concerned do not receive military training.
