There may be additional elements related to indigenous peoples and their relationship to lands, territories and resources which have not been captured by these examples. The Special Rapporteur welcomes the comments of all concerned to ensure that the final working paper captures the essence of this profound relationship.

Indigenous societies in a number of countries are in a state of rapid deterioration and change due to the denial of the rights of the indigenous peoples to lands, territories and resources.
