LETTER DATED 22 NOVEMBER 1993 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF KUWAIT TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF
THE SECURITY COUNCIL

On Sunday, 21 November 1993, around 9.30 p.m. (local time) two officers in a United Nations Iraq-Kuwait Observation Mission (UNIKOM) patrol (No. 137), on regular duty between Kuwaiti police posts Al-Azmiyah and Al Mazari', were intercepted by three Iraqis brandishing AK-47s. The armed Iraqis forced UNIKOM officers out of their vehicle, searched them and then hijacked the vehicle into Iraq. The two officers, a Major (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) and a Captain (Uruguay), proceeded to Kuwaiti post Al Mazari' where they were given the necessary assistance by members of the post.

This violation against United Nations personnel is yet another in a series of violations against the territorial integrity of Kuwait. The hijacking took place 400 metres south of boundary pillar 95.

I should appreciate it if you would bring the above to the immediate attention of the members of the Security Council and arrange for the circulation of the letter as a document of the Security Council.
