## Letter dated 13 November 1993 from the Prime Minister of Bosnia and Herzegovina addressed to the President of the Security Council

We are addressing you once again with the request that the city of Mostar and its surroundings be designated as a safe area and that an emergency meeting of the Security Council be held regarding this issue.

We would like to remind you that on 23 July 1993, the President of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina asked for such a decision to be made.

A month later, on 26 August 1993, I addressed the President of the Security Council in a letter with the repeated request that, due to the increasing suffering of the population, the Security Council decide without further delay on options for new and stronger measures in accordance with paragraph 14 of Security Council resolution 836 (1993) of 4 June 1993, including the designation of Mostar as a safe area.

Unfortunately these requests, as well as the address of the President of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Mr. Alija Izetbegovic, before the General Assembly, did not move the Security Council to undertake decisive and effective measures to stop the terrible tragedy of 55,000 inhabitants of Mostar and people expelled in the aggressors' campaign of ethnic cleansing.

The destruction of the Old Bridge, a monument of the most important category, 427 years old, represents not only an unprecedented act of barbarism, but also a deadly situation for the more than 10,000 civilians on the right bank of the Neretva river in Mostar.

We call upon you, once again, to urgently declare Mostar a safe area and to undertake decisive measures using the United Nations forces available in the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina.
