ORGANIZATION OF WORK

Note by the Secretariat

1. In order to assist the Sixth Committee in the organization of its work, the Secretariat finds it appropriate, in the light of General Assembly resolutions 1898 (XVIII) of 11 November 1963 and 32/71 of 9 December 1977 and of rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, to draw the Sixth Committee's attention to the following.

I. ITEMS ALLOCATED TO THE SIXTH COMMITTEE

2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 19 September 1997, the General Assembly decided to allocate 10 items to the Sixth Committee. The titles of these items and their numbers are reproduced in the letter dated 19 September 1997 from the President of the General Assembly addressed to the Chairman of the Sixth Committee (A/C.6/52/1).

II. DOCUMENTATION RELATING TO THE ITEMS ALLOCATED TO THE SIXTH COMMITTEE

3. The following table lists the documents of the fifty-second session of the General Assembly relating to the items allocated to the Sixth Committee. It includes references to the reports of commissions or committees and the reports that are to be submitted by the Secretary-General pursuant to resolutions or decisions of preceding sessions of the Assembly, as well as to the documents circulated under the agenda items allocated to the Sixth Committee,* in accordance with requests of Member States.

- III. DATE FOR CONCLUDING THE WORK OF THE COMMITTEE, ORDER AND APPROXIMATE DATES OF CONSIDERATION OF ITEMS
- 4. Rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly provides that:

"Each Main Committee, taking into account the closing date for the session fixed by the General Assembly on the recommendation of the General Committee, shall adopt its own priorities and meet as may be necessary to complete the consideration of the items referred to it. It shall at the beginning of the session adopt a programme of work indicating, if possible, a target date for the conclusion of its work, the approximate dates of consideration of items and the number of meetings to be allocated to each item."

5. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 19 September 1997, the General Assembly decided that the fifty-second session should recess not later than Tuesday, 16 December 1997. Under the circumstances, it appears advisable that the Sixth Committee should arrange its schedule of meetings in such a way that it will conclude its work not later than Friday, 21 November 1997.

6. The Sixth Committee may wish to consider, for the purpose of adopting its programme of work, the following timetable, drawn up on the basis of the relevant General Assembly resolutions as well as previous programmes of work adopted by the Committee, which indicates approximate dates of consideration of agenda items referred to it:

IV. ESTABLISHMENT OF WORKING GROUPS AND HOLDING OF CONSULTATIONS

- 7. Concerning agenda item 152, "Measures to eliminate international terrorism", the General Assembly, at its fifty-first session recommended that the work of the Ad Hoc Committee established by resolution 51/210 continue during the fifty-second session of the General Assembly from 22 September to 3 October 1997 in the framework of a working group of the Sixth Committee (resolution 51/210 of 17 December 1996).
- 8. As regards agenda item 146, "United Nations Decade of International Law", the General Assembly at its fifty-first session requested the Working Group of the Sixth Committee on the item to continue its work at the fifty-second session in accordance with its mandate and methods of work (resolution 51/157 of 16 December 1996).
- 9. Since the conference services to be provided for meetings of the working groups and for the holding of informal consultations are those allocated to the Sixth Committee, it is important that such meetings and consultations be held in place of, rather than in addition to, meetings of the Committee.

V. COLLOQUIUM ON PROGRESSIVE DEVELOPMENT AND CODIFICATION OF INTERNATIONAL LAW

10. The General Assembly, at its fifty-first session, requested the Secretary-General to make appropriate arrangements to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the establishment of the International Law Commission through a colloquium on the progressive development and codification of international law, to be held during the consideration in the Sixth Committee of the report of the Commission on the work of its forty-ninth session (resolution 51/160 of 16 December 1996). The colloquium will consist of three sessions, one in the morning and one in the afternoon of 28 October, and one in the morning of 29 October 1997.

VI. DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF DRAFT RESOLUTIONS WITH FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

11. According to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, "no resolution involving expenditure shall be recommended by a committee for approval by the General Assembly unless it is accompanied by an estimate of expenditures prepared by the Secretary-General". It is therefore imperative that the Main Committees allow sufficient time for the preparation of the estimates of expenditures by the Secretariat and for their consideration by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and by the Fifth Committee. Under the circumstances, if Friday, 21 November 1997, is accepted as the concluding date for the work of the Sixth Committee (see para. 5 above), Monday, 10 November 1997, would have to be considered as the mandatory deadline for submission to the Fifth Committee of draft resolutions with financial implications.

- 12. The available conference facilities will, in principle, enable the Committee to hold an average of six plenary meetings per week and the Working Group referred to in paragraph 7 above to hold 10 meetings per week. Normally, morning meetings will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and afternoon meetings from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- 13. In order to avoid difficulties in the organization of services for the meetings of regional groups of the Committee, it is suggested that all requests for such meetings be channelled to the Planning and Meetings Services Section through the Secretary of the Committee.
