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REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CONFERENCES\*

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## I. CALENDAR OF CONFERENCES AND MEETINGS

### A. Matters related to, and inter-sessional departures from, the approved calendar for 1997

#### Introduction and overview

1. In its resolution 51/211 A of 18 December 1996, the General Assembly approved the draft revised calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for 1997 as set forth in the annex to the report of the Committee on Conferences to the Assembly at its fifty-first session and amended by subsequent decisions taken by the Assembly during that session.<sup>1</sup>
2. At its 373rd meeting, on 26 August 1994, the Committee on Conferences had decided that requests for inter-sessional departures submitted to the Committee should, in future, be reviewed by the Bureau, in consultation with the Secretariat, for subsequent action.
3. At its 379th meeting, on 23 March 1995, the Committee agreed that proposed changes to the calendar that did not have programme budget implications could be dealt with by the Secretariat in consultation with the Bureau of the Committee.
4. At its substantive session of 1995, the Committee decided that requests for inter-sessional departures submitted to the Committee that involved a change of venue should be referred to the members for approval. Departures that involved other types of changes should, as the Committee had decided at its substantive session of 1994, be reviewed by the Bureau, in consultation with the Secretariat, for subsequent action.
5. The Committee was advised of a number of such changes authorized by the Bureau during the course of 1997. The nature of the requests for change of venue and the action taken by the Committee are described below:

B. Adoption of the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings for 1998-1999

Introduction and overview

6. At its 400th and 402nd meetings, on 25 and 26 August 1997, the Committee on Conferences reviewed the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings for 1998-1999 (A/AC.172/1997/CRP.2 and Add.1).

Conclusions and recommendations

7. The Committee recommended to the General Assembly that it:

(a) Adopt the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings for 1998-1999 as submitted and orally amended;

(b) Authorize the Committee to make adjustments to the calendar of conferences and meetings for 1998 that might become necessary as a result of action and decisions taken by the Assembly at its fifty-second session.

8. The Committee noted that the Secretariat had taken into account the arrangements referred to in paragraph 6 of General Assembly resolution 51/211 A. Accordingly, no sessions were scheduled to open or close on 29 January or 7 April 1998, and meetings would not be held on those days.

9. The Committee noted that the convening at Rome in 1998 of the United Nations Diplomatic Conference of Plenipotentiaries on the Establishment of an International Criminal Court would be in accordance with paragraph 5 of General Assembly resolution 40/243 of 18 December 1985, by which the Assembly decided that United Nations bodies may hold sessions away from their established headquarters when a Government issuing an invitation for a session to be held within its territory has agreed to defray, after consultation with the Secretary-General as to their nature and possible extent, the actual additional costs directly or indirectly involved.

10. The Committee decided, as a convenience to calendar users, to add the meetings of the treaty bodies negotiated under United Nations auspices to the calendar of conferences and meetings.

11. The Committee also decided that the list of meetings of the specialized agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency should be presented together with the calendar of United Nations conferences and meetings.

12. The Committee further decided that abbreviations should be used in the calendar to the extent possible, with due regard to clarity.

13. The Committee recommended that, when planning the calendar of conferences and meetings, every effort should be made to avoid simultaneous peak periods at the various duty stations.

### C. Improved utilization of conference-servicing resources

#### 1. Meeting statistics of United Nations organs

##### Introduction and overview

14. Since 1983, the Committee on Conferences has studied a series of reports containing the meeting statistics and, in more recent years, the documentation statistics, of a core sample of United Nations organs in New York, Geneva and Vienna.

15. At its substantive session of 1995, the Committee took note of a synoptic report, by sector, of meetings held during the bienniums 1992-1993 and 1994-1995, including the notional cost of conference services provided, as well as a breakdown of meeting services and documentation costs (A/AC.172/161 and Corr.1 and 2, annex III), and requested the Secretariat to refine the methodology used in drafting the report and to continue to provide such information to the Committee at its future sessions. At its organizational session for 1996, the Committee decided to defer until 1997 its consideration of the synoptic report.

16. At its 400th and 402nd meetings, on 25 and 26 August 1997, the Committee reviewed the report of the Secretary-General on meeting statistics of United Nations organs that had met in 1996, including a synoptic report by sector on meetings held during the bienniums 1994-1995 and 1996-1997 (A/AC.172/1997/3 and Add.1).

##### Discussion

17. The view was expressed that the synoptic report represented a successful attempt at estimating conference-servicing costs.

18. The view was also expressed that no effort should be spared to ensure the accuracy of the data contained in reports on meeting statistics, as the information reported might serve as the basis for decisions regarding conference services taken by other bodies.

19. With regard to the methodology used to compute the utilization factor, the view was expressed that the newly introduced practice of weighting late starts more heavily than early endings should not be continued.

## Conclusions and recommendations

20. The Committee on Conferences welcomed the improvement, relative to 1995, in the overall utilization factor for 1996, which exceeded the benchmark of 80 per cent, in particular at Geneva and Vienna.

21. The Committee noted that the improvement was substantiated regardless of the various methodologies discussed during the session.

22. The Committee decided that the data on late starting and early ending would no longer be rounded off and that the average utilization factor would no longer be computed.

23. The Committee recommended that the computation of utilization factors in future reports should be computerized.

24. The Committee also recommended that output statistics of conference services at the various duty stations should be further standardized in terms both of definition and of the methodology used to compile them.

25. The Committee took note of the synoptic report by sector on meetings held during the bienniums 1994-1995 and 1996-1997 (A/AC.172/1997/3/Add.1).

### 2. Consultations with bodies concerning utilization of the conference services and facilities available to them

#### Introduction and overview

26. In paragraph 10 of its resolution 51/211 A, the General Assembly requested the bodies that had not fully utilized their meeting entitlements, including the duration of their sessions, to review their entitlements and to report the results of their review to the Assembly through the Committee on Conferences. In paragraph 12 of the resolution, the Assembly reiterated its request to the Committee, in consultation with the organs concerned, to examine the cases where the utilization factor was lower than the established benchmark figure for at least three sessions, with a view to reporting on problems and factors that had given rise to such a situation, and to make appropriate recommendations in order to achieve the optimum utilization of conference-servicing resources.

27. At its substantive session of 1996, the Committee requested its Chairman to consult on its behalf with the chairmen of bodies that had consistently utilized less than the applicable benchmark figure (80 per cent) of their allocated resources for the past three sessions, with a view to making appropriate recommendations in order to achieve the optimum utilization of conference-servicing resources.

28. The Committee further requested its Chairman to transmit a letter to the chairmen of subsidiary bodies that had utilized less than 80 per cent of their conference-servicing resources in 1995 to invite them to report on measures taken to improve their utilization of those resources and realistically to assess their need for such resources, with a view to reducing the conference resources requested.

29. At its 400th meeting, on 25 August 1997, the Committee reviewed the report of the Secretary-General on these matters (A/52/215 and Add.1).



## Discussion

30. The view was expressed that, as chairmen changed yearly, the utilization of conference-servicing resources could be enhanced if the Chairman of the Committee on Conferences held consultations with incoming chairmen prior to the opening of sessions. The chairmen should be informed of the relevant guidelines and recommendations concerning the utilization of conference-servicing resources and of the fact that utilization was monitored and reported to the General Assembly. Moreover, they should be provided with standard information on measures taken by intergovernmental bodies to improve the utilization of conference-servicing resources. In addition, the chairmen of intergovernmental bodies should hold inter-sessional consultations on organizational matters with the members.

31. Regional groups also should be informed that the utilization of resources would be reflected in the statistics of their sessional body.

## Conclusions and recommendations

32. The Committee on Conferences took note of the report of the Secretary-General on the results of the review of entitlements carried out by subsidiary bodies that had not fully utilized their meeting entitlements, including the duration of their sessions, and the review of the problems and factors involved in bodies whose utilization factor was below the benchmark figure for at least three sessions (A/52/215 and Add.1).

33. The Committee requested its Chairman to continue to consult on its behalf with the chairmen of bodies that had consistently utilized less than the applicable benchmark figure of their allocated resources for the past three sessions, with a view to making appropriate recommendations in order to achieve the optimum utilization of conference-servicing resources.

### 3. Provision of interpretation services to meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States

## Introduction and overview

34. In paragraph 19 of resolution 51/211 A, the General Assembly reiterated its request to the Secretary-General to provide, within the resources requested for conference services for the biennium 1998-1999, interpretation services for meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States upon request by those groupings, taking into account the priority due to meetings included in the calendar of conferences and meetings, and to submit a report on the implementation of that decision to the Assembly at its fifty-second session through the Committee on Conferences.

35. At its 400th meeting, on 25 August 1997, the Committee considered an oral report on the matter.

## Discussion

36. The view was expressed that, in spite of the genuine efforts made by the Secretariat to provide interpretation services to meetings of regional and other

major groupings of States, reliance on released capacity considerably hindered the work of the bodies in question.

37. Regret was expressed that the established capacities at all duty stations were insufficient to provide full services in all languages to all meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States.

#### Conclusions and recommendations

38. The Committee on Conferences took note of the oral report on the provision of interpretation services to meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States.

39. In view of the importance of meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States for the smooth functioning of sessional bodies, the Committee expressed concern that 32 per cent of requests for interpretation services for such meetings had been denied. Nonetheless, it recognized that meetings of Charter and mandated bodies must be serviced as a priority.

40. The Committee urged intergovernmental bodies to spare no effort in the planning stage to take into account meetings of their regional and other major groupings of Member States, and to dovetail such meetings with those of the sessional body. In addition, intergovernmental bodies should notify Conference Services well in advance of any cancellations so that unutilized conference-servicing resources could, to the extent possible, be reassigned to meetings of regional and other major groupings of States.

#### 4. Cost-accounting system for conference services

##### Introduction and overview

41. In paragraph 1 of resolution 51/211 C of 18 December 1996, the General Assembly strongly urged the Secretary-General, having recourse to voluntary and internal expertise within the United Nations system, to develop the cost-accounting system for conference services no later than the 1997 substantive session of the Committee on Conferences.

42. In paragraph 2 of the resolution, the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to report, through the Committee on Conferences, to each subsidiary organ of the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council on the cost of conference services it utilized in the year concluded in order to enable those organs to plan more effectively.

43. At its 401st and 402nd meetings, on 26 August 1997, the Committee considered two notes by the Secretariat (A/AC.172/1997/CRP.4 and CRP.5).

##### Discussion

44. In introducing the note by the Secretariat contained in document A/AC.172/1997/CRP.4, the representative of the Secretariat referred to the difficulties encountered in establishing a cost-accounting system for conference services and to the shortcomings that hampered the establishment of a comprehensive system at the current stage. He pointed out that the financial

module of the Integrated Management Information System, the source of the data used, was available at Headquarters only.

45. The representative of the Secretariat assured the members of the Committee that, while the cost-accounting system would be designed as a stand-alone system for use by Conference Services, as described in paragraph 12 of the note, it could be applied to any part of the Secretariat involved in the management of resources.

46. As to the cost estimates, recourse should be made to in-house resources during the development stage, including staff costs, hardware and software. While provision had not been made in the budget for the development of the cost-accounting system, efforts would be made to finance it through resources allocated for technological innovations. The view was expressed that all costs in relation to the development of the system should be absorbed.

47. The view was expressed that the budget services at Headquarters should play a leading role, in close cooperation with their counterparts at other duty stations.

48. The view was also expressed that the goal of the exercise was to develop an objective, transparent methodology common to all users of the data, which would make it possible to draw comparisons and operational conclusions, facilitate planning and formulate policy.

49. The view was expressed that the most important criterion for assessing efficiency seemed to be actual costs per unit of production, provided that a uniform methodology for all duty stations was followed.

50. Attention was drawn to paragraph 9 of the note, which stressed the need to clarify the purpose for which the information generated by the cost-accounting would be used, since care should be taken not to misinterpret or misuse that information.

#### Conclusions and recommendations

51. The Committee on Conferences took note of the notes by the Secretariat on the cost-accounting system (A/AC.172/1997/CRP.4 and CRP.5).

52. The Committee supported in principle further development of the cost-accounting system for conference services. It recommended that the system be developed further so as to encompass other areas of the Secretariat. It also recommended that the development of the system should reflect the experience of other duty stations.

53. The Committee requested the Secretary-General to report on the notional costs of conference services at the United Nations Office at Geneva, the United Nations Office at Vienna and the United Nations Office at Nairobi.

5. Subsidiary bodies authorized to meet away from their established headquarters in accordance with section I, paragraph 4, of General Assembly resolution 40/243

#### Introduction and overview

54. In paragraph 8 of resolution 51/211 A, the General Assembly invited all its subsidiary bodies authorized to meet away from their established headquarters to review, in the interest of improved efficiency and cost-effectiveness, the exception to the headquarters rule in the light of the current situation of their work, and to make recommendations thereon, through the Committee on Conferences, to the Assembly at its fifty-second session.

55. In paragraph 9 of the resolution, the Assembly invited the Economic and Social Council to request all its subsidiary bodies to carry out the same review.

56. At its 400th and 402nd meetings, on 25 and 26 August 1997, the Committee considered the report of the Secretary-General on the matter (A/52/216 and Add.1).

#### Discussion

57. With regard to the 1998 and 1999 regional seminars of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, the representative of the Secretariat explained that provision had been made for the seminars in the programme of work of the Special Committee, which had been approved by the General Assembly.

58. The view was expressed that the Committee on Conferences should recommend to the General Assembly that the Assembly grant waivers to the headquarters rule to all bodies authorized to meet away from their established headquarters, with the exception of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, in view of the fact that the Committee on Conferences could not reach agreement on that matter. The view was also expressed that the Special Committee should be included in the recommendation of the Committee on Conferences.

#### Conclusions and recommendations

59. The Committee on Conferences recommended to the General Assembly that the Assembly grant waivers to the headquarters rule solely on the basis of the calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations which the Committee recommended for adoption by the Assembly.

60. The Committee further recommended that the Assembly invite all its subsidiary bodies that were authorized to meet away from their established headquarters to keep under review the exception to the headquarters rule in the light of the current situation of their work, and to report any changes to the Assembly through the Committee on Conferences.

## 6. Improved coordination of conference services

### Introduction and overview

61. At its substantive session of 1995 the Committee on Conferences decided to consider on a biennial basis the means to ensure the improved coordination of conferences within the United Nations system. Moreover, it requested Conference Services to maintain an active dialogue with the substantive secretariats of intergovernmental bodies, providing statistics and information on previous performance, as well as guidelines on ways and means to enhance utilization of conference-servicing resources. At its substantive session of 1996, the Committee endorsed the idea of the Secretariat to make the active dialogue a permanent coordination feature, and directed that such action should be taken at Headquarters, as well as at the United Nations Office at Geneva and the United Nations Office at Vienna.

62. In paragraph 15 of resolution 51/211 A, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to ensure closer cooperation between Headquarters, the United Nations Office at Geneva, the United Nations Office at Vienna and the United Nations Office at Nairobi in order to improve the coordination of conference services. In paragraph 16 of the resolution, the Assembly requested the Secretariat to engage on a regular basis in an active dialogue with Member States as a permanent feature at Headquarters, as well as at the United Nations Office at Geneva, the United Nations Office at Vienna and the United Nations Office at Nairobi, in order to improve the coordination of conference services.

63. At the 400th and 402nd meetings of the Committee, on 25 and 26 August 1997, the representative of the Secretariat presented an oral report on these matters.

### Discussion

64. The view was expressed that duty stations away from Headquarters were less attractive to conference services staff because of the more limited career possibilities at those stations. While a common staffing table might improve that state of affairs, a system of managed assignments was preferable in that it made more effective use of resources, was more flexible, increased mobility of staff in times of need and ensured higher quality of language services than that achieved with temporary assistance. Such a system would require incentives so as to avoid the perception of involuntary assignments. Moreover, it was relevant not only for language staff but also for other personnel.

65. The view was further expressed that the Committee should recommend to the General Assembly that it consider the introduction of a system of managed assignments for language staff on the basis of incentives. The Committee should also recommend to the Secretary-General that revision of existing incentives, including promotion, be considered with a view to enhancing the mobility of language staff. Those recommendations would ensure that the quality of conference services would be the same regardless of the duty station. The view was also expressed that the two recommendations should not be made.

### Conclusions and recommendations

66. The Committee on Conferences took note with appreciation of the oral report presented on improved coordination of conference services.

67. The Committee requested the Secretariat to continue to engage on an ongoing basis in an active dialogue with Member States at Headquarters, as well as at the United Nations Offices at Geneva, Vienna and Nairobi, so as to enhance the coordination of conference services.

68. The Committee welcomed the initiative taken by the Secretariat to arrange a video-meeting on matters relating to conference services with the United Nations Offices at Geneva, Vienna and Nairobi.

69. The Committee requested the Secretary-General to include input from the United Nations Offices at Geneva, Vienna and Nairobi in the preparation of reports for substantive sessions of the Committee on Conferences.

D. Requests for exceptions to section I, paragraph 7, of  
General Assembly resolution 40/243

Introduction and overview

70. At its 399th meeting, on 25 August 1997, the Committee considered a note by its secretariat containing requests from subsidiary bodies for exceptions to be made to section I, paragraph 7, of General Assembly resolution 40/243 of 18 December 1985, which states that no subsidiary organ of the General Assembly may meet at United Nations Headquarters during a regular session of the Assembly unless explicitly authorized by the Assembly (A/AC.172/1997/CRP.3).

71. In accordance with the procedure established by the Committee, the requests included explanations as to (a) why the bodies wished to meet; (b) why they had not completed their work by the deadline of 1 September laid down in section I, paragraph 6, of resolution 40/243; (c) why it was necessary to meet during the Assembly session; and (d) how many meetings would be required. Statistical information was also provided on the number of meetings, if any, the bodies concerned had held during the fifty-first session of the Assembly and the efficiency with which they had utilized the resources made available to them.

Conclusions and recommendations

72. The Committee on Conferences recommended to the General Assembly that it explicitly authorize the following bodies to meet in New York during the fifty-second session of the General Assembly, on the understanding that meetings would have to be accommodated as facilities and services became available so that the activities of the Assembly itself were not adversely affected: Committee on Relations with the Host Country; Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People; Working Group on the Financing of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East; Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme and of the United Nations Population Fund; Committee on Conferences; and Committee for Programme and Coordination.

E. Consideration of the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings of subsidiary organs of the Economic and Social Council for 1998-1999

Introduction and overview

73. In its decision 1988/103 of 5 February 1988, the Economic and Social Council invited the Committee on Conferences to review the Council's draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings and to submit, as appropriate, its recommendations thereon to the Council.

74. At its 398th meeting, on 16 June 1997, the Committee considered the Council's draft calendar of conferences and meetings for 1998 and 1999 (E/1997/L.18 and A/AC.172/1997/CRP.1).

Discussion

75. Clarification was sought and received from the Secretariat regarding various aspects of the provisional calendar of conferences and meetings for 1998-1999 in the economic, social and related fields.

76. The question of the biennialization of conferences and meetings referred to in paragraph 2 (f) (ii) of Council resolution 1988/77 of 29 July 1988 was recalled. Concern was expressed regarding the increase in requests from intergovernmental bodies to seek exceptions to the biennialization of their sessions.

77. The Committee was assured by the Secretariat that the subsidiary bodies of the Council were, to the extent possible, scheduled to end their 1998-1999 sessions at least eight weeks prior to the scheduled dates for substantive sessions of the Economic and Social Council, in accordance with paragraph 2 (f) (i) of Council resolution 1988/77.

Conclusions and recommendations

78. The Committee on Conferences recommended the adoption of the provisional calendar of conferences and meetings of the subsidiary bodies of the Economic and Social Council for 1998-1999 (E/1997/L.18) with the amendments read out by the representative of the Secretariat.

79. The Committee also recommended that the Council continue its consideration of the biennialization of meetings of its subsidiary bodies.

80. The Committee urged the Council to continue to review its calendar as a whole in the context of its review of the mandates, composition, functions and working methods of its functional commissions and expert groups and bodies.

## II. CONTROL AND LIMITATION OF DOCUMENTATION

### A. Implementation of General Assembly resolution 50/206 C

#### Introduction and overview

81. In paragraph 5 of its resolution 51/211 B of 18 December 1996, the General Assembly reiterated its recommendations on the control and limitation of documentation made to intergovernmental bodies in its resolution 50/206 C of 23 December 1995, and requested those bodies to report to it, through the Committee on Conferences, on measures taken to implement that resolution.

82. At its 400th and 401st meetings, on 25 and 26 August 1997, the Committee considered the report of the Secretary-General on the matter (A/52/291).

#### Discussion

83. As part of the reform measures he had announced on 17 March 1997, the Secretary-General had decided that all documents originating in the Secretariat should be no longer than 16 pages, a reduction from the former standard of 24 pages. The Secretary-General had also indicated that proposals would be presented to intergovernmental bodies to secure approval for a reduction in the length of reports produced by those bodies from the desired limit of 32 pages to 20 pages.

84. Satisfaction was expressed at the progress reported by other duty stations in reducing the volume and length of the documents processed.

85. The representative of the Secretariat stated that a number of steps had been taken over the past year to reduce paper output, thanks in part to a wider access to the optical disk system. The number of copies of documents kept in stock had been cut in half, and the circulation of documents within the Secretariat had been curtailed. Print runs were being adjusted. The development of new document formats, based on different type styles and double-column layouts, could reduce paper consumption for a single document by up to 50 per cent.

86. The effect of measures to reduce word output, on the other hand, varied from one duty station to another. At Headquarters, it had been estimated that lowering the page limit from 24 to 16 would reduce the total volume of documentation by 6 per cent, since only about 25 per cent of the documents processed by the Secretariat fell into the category to which the limit could be applied, and since numerous reports covered by that measure were already no more than 16 pages in length.

87. Although the timeliness of document delivery depended on the Secretariat's workload at the time when the documents were submitted, reducing the length of documents would, in general, result in a more rapid turnover.

88. While there had been, in 1996, a reversal of a long-standing trend towards a higher volume of documentation, that had been due to a decline in the general level of activity in the Secretariat as a result of budgetary constraints. The level of activity had begun to recover by the end of 1996, and current projections indicated that translation output would increase to pre-1996 levels during the current year. Reproduction output, however, was expected to remain



lower than in the pre-1996 period and even to continue to decline as a result of measures to reduce the production of printed paper.

89. In the light of the above, 1996 could be viewed as an anomalous year. For that reason, an historical average, calculated on the basis of the previous five-year period, would serve as the starting point for the target set by the Secretary-General of a reduction of 25 per cent in the volume of documentation by the end of 1998.

### Conclusions and recommendations

90. The Committee on Conferences took note of the report of the Secretary-General on the implementation of General Assembly resolution 50/206 C (A/52/291). It recommended that the General Assembly consider the desirability of inviting intergovernmental bodies to reduce the length of their reports from the desired limit of 32 pages to 20 pages over a period of time, rather than with a fixed deadline. It also recommended that the Assembly consider the possibility of making specific suggestions to intergovernmental bodies on how that reduction could be accomplished.

#### B. Provision of written meeting records to subsidiary organs of the General Assembly

##### Introduction and overview

91. In paragraph 3 of resolution 50/206 B of 23 December 1995, the General Assembly noted the intention of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space to replace its verbatim records by unedited transcripts, and requested the Committee to keep the Assembly informed, through the Committee on Conferences, of the experience of that body regarding unedited transcripts. In paragraph 4 of the resolution, it took note of the decision of the Committee on Conferences contained in paragraph 75 of its report,<sup>2</sup> and requested the Committee to report on the implementation of that decision to the Assembly at its fifty-first session.

92. In paragraph 6 of resolution 51/211 B of 18 December 1996, the General Assembly requested the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space to continue to keep it informed, through the Committee on Conferences, of its experience with the use of unedited transcripts. In paragraph 7 of the resolution, it took note of the decision of the Committee on Conferences contained in paragraph 89 of its report,<sup>3</sup> and requested the Committee to report on the implementation of that decision to the Assembly at its fifty-second session.

93. At the Committee's 399th meeting, on 25 August 1997, the representative of the Secretariat presented an oral report on the matter.

##### Discussion

94. The view was expressed that, as only four of the bodies entitled to written meeting records had responded to the invitation to report on their experience with the use of unedited transcripts, no conclusions regarding the cost-efficiency of the measure could be drawn at the current stage. However, if a larger number of bodies participated in the experiment, it was possible that substantial savings could be realized. The view was also expressed that while

some bodies would find the use of unedited transcripts adequate to their needs, others, given the politically sensitive nature of their mandates, would prefer to continue to receive the usual records. It would be useful to have a cost-benefit analysis of the use of different types of meeting records, since a simple comparison of notional costs, as opposed to real costs, could be misleading.

### Conclusions and recommendations

95. The Committee on Conferences took note of the oral report on the provision of written meeting records to subsidiary organs of the General Assembly. It requested the Chairman to write to the chairmen of those bodies entitled to written meeting records who had yet to respond to the previous letter from the Chairman to remind them of the invitation to consider the possibility of requesting the Secretariat to issue unedited transcripts of one meeting for comparison purposes with a view to the possible substitution of such transcripts for their usual records in the future.

#### C. Review of document requirements of Member States and the Secretariat

##### Introduction and overview

96. In paragraph 2 of resolution 51/211 B, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to continue to invite Member States to review their document requirements in order to identify and, where possible, reduce the number and types of documents requested. In paragraph 3 of the resolution, it requested the Secretary-General to review the Secretariat's internal requirements in order to avoid a surplus of documents provided in the Secretariat.

97. At the 399th meeting of the Committee on Conferences, on 25 August 1997, the representative of the Secretariat presented an oral report on the matter.

##### Discussion

98. Satisfaction was expressed at the clear trend shown in the report towards the reduction of documentation requirements indicated by Missions in reply to a survey of their needs that had been undertaken by the Secretariat, despite the fact that only 60 per cent of the Missions surveyed had responded so far. Reminders should be sent to the Missions that had not yet responded. It would be useful to know whether efforts to limit the number of documents requested had also been undertaken at other duty stations.

99. Concern was expressed that some Missions were continuing to receive unsolicited extra copies of documents from the Secretariat. Concern was also expressed that, if fewer copies of documents were distributed, more frequent resort to photocopying would be needed, which could have an adverse impact on costs.

100. The representative of the Secretariat stated that the optical disk system as an alternative to hard-copy distribution had been in use for several years at the United Nations Office at Geneva and had been introduced earlier in the year at the United Nations Office at Vienna. At Geneva, massive reductions in distribution had been achieved through the pruning of address lists.

101. The Secretariat would ensure that documents were indeed distributed to the Missions in accordance with their needs. In an effort to facilitate the updating by Missions of their requirements, the Secretariat had provided them with lists of document symbols, indicating the number of copies of each document that had been supplied in the past.

102. Internal distribution rules had been changed to achieve significant reductions, and stocks had been cut by half, which helped to alleviate storage problems. The optical disk system made it possible to print on demand any essential documents that were out of stock.

### Conclusions and recommendations

103. The Committee on Conferences took note of the oral report on the review of document requirements of Member States and the Secretariat.

#### D. Access to the optical disk system by developing countries

##### Introduction and overview

104. In paragraph 3 of resolution 50/206 D of 23 December 1995, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to present proposals to it at its fifty-first session through the Committee on Conferences on facilitating access by developing countries to the optical disk system in all official languages, taking into account the possible savings from reduced copying and distribution costs.

105. In paragraph 4 of resolution 51/211 C of 18 December 1996, the General Assembly strongly urged the Secretary-General to provide proposals to the Fifth Committee at the first part of the resumed fifty-first session, in accordance with paragraph 3 of its resolution 50/206 D, taking into account the possible savings from reduced reproduction and distribution costs.

106. At its 402nd meeting, on 26 August 1997, the Committee considered the report of the Secretary-General on the matter (A/C.5/51/56).

##### Discussion

107. In November 1996, access by Internet users to the optical disk system had become available when a World Wide Web server interface had been put into operation at Headquarters. Since 30 June 1997, all permanent missions had been connected to the Internet and through it could access documents stored on the optical disk system. Work on the development of a policy for the further expansion of the optical disk system was in progress.

108. A revised version of the United Nations Web site had been launched in September 1996 in response to growing demands for information (between 1 January and 31 July 1997, nearly 13 million "hits" to the site had been recorded). The policy on the Web site was to develop interfaces with existing databases in the languages in which they existed. The top level and navigational menus would be in the two working languages of the Secretariat, English and French. Work would continue on the addition of other languages, taking into account the availability of appropriate resources.

109. The view was expressed that the increasing use of electronic media within the United Nations should not be interpreted as eliminating the need for paper-based communication, which continued to be essential, in particular for the developing countries.

#### Conclusions and recommendations

110. The Committee on Conferences took note of the report of the Secretary-General on access to the optical disk system (A/C.5/51/56), and recommended that the further development of the optical disk system should be encouraged.

#### E. Translation-related matters

##### Introduction and overview

111. In paragraph 1 of resolution 51/211 D of 18 December 1996, the General Assembly noted the efforts made by the translation services to improve the quality of translation of documents in all six official languages of the United Nations, and encouraged those services to continue to spare no effort to that end and to continue to report to the Committee on Conferences on additional efforts made in that regard.

112. At the Committee's 399th meeting, on 25 August 1997, the representative of the Secretariat presented an oral report on the matter.

##### Discussion

113. Satisfaction was expressed at the release in April 1997 of funds that had been appropriated in the programme budget for the biennium 1996-1997 for six new P-3 translator posts and 194 translator workstations.

114. However, concern was expressed that the decreased levels of funding in the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1998-1999 for the recruitment of permanent translation staff and the higher proportion of the translation workload that was to be outsourced could adversely affect the quality of translation. In order to offset that problem, it was suggested that former United Nations translators could be recruited to work on a contractual basis, through the use of remote translation.

115. Concern was also expressed at the continuing delays in the delivery of translations to delegations, which sometimes made it necessary to delay the start of meetings. It was suggested that machine-assisted translation might help to strike a balance between improving the quality and improving the speed of translation.

116. The view was also expressed that the poor quality of translations sometimes received by the Missions could be addressed through greater personal accountability on the part of translators and revisers.

117. The representative of the Secretariat stated that contractual translation currently accounted for approximately 15 per cent of the translation workload. While contractual translation had been strongly recommended as the least costly method of producing translations, careful monitoring was needed to ensure that

outside translators had the necessary qualifications. Quality control of outsourced translations had been expanded since 1996. Because of budgetary restrictions, such control had not been comprehensive in the past, but the Secretariat planned to continue to expand it in the future.

118. Remote translation arrangements with the United Nations Office at Vienna, whose peak periods fell at different times of the year, were already being utilized to expand translation capacity at Headquarters.

119. While there had been many complaints about delays in the delivery of translations, such problems were frequently attributable to the late submission of documents by the substantive departments. For example, by 1 September every year, no more than 25 per cent of the pre-session documentation of the General Assembly had usually been received.

#### Conclusions and recommendations

120. The Committee on Conferences took note with appreciation of the oral report on translation-related matters.

- F. Comprehensive survey by the Joint Inspection Unit of the role publications play in implementing mandates of intergovernmental bodies and the extent to which recurrent publications could be made more cost-effective in this regard

#### Introduction and overview

121. In paragraph 10 of resolution 50/206 C the General Assembly endorsed the recommendation made by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions that the Joint Inspection Unit be requested to conduct a comprehensive survey of the role publications play in implementing mandates of intergovernmental bodies and the extent to which recurrent publications could be made more cost-effective in that regard. In paragraph 14 of resolution 51/211 B, the Assembly reiterated its request to the Joint Inspection Unit to conduct the comprehensive survey in question.

122. At its 399th and 401st meetings, on 25 and 26 August 1997, the Committee considered a report of the Joint Inspection Unit on the matter (A/51/946).

#### Discussion

123. The view was expressed that the 18 recommendations made by the Joint Inspection Unit provided very useful guidelines for improving the relevance and effectiveness of the United Nations publications programme. Particular importance was attached to recommendations 4 (strengthening the role of the Publications Board), 7 (identifying costs), 11 (developing a cost-accounting system) and 18 (promoting sales more vigorously).

124. It was stated that at Headquarters, in accordance with current practice, sales revenue was primarily used to finance sales-related costs. The income generated by the sale of publications was credited to one of the budget income sections and was eventually deducted from the contributions of Member States. In other organizations of the United Nations system, however, sales income was deposited into a special fund, with a certain percentage being distributed to

the author departments. The Inspectors were of the view that income from the sale of publications could be used in a more rational manner. The view was expressed that while it was necessary to provide incentives for more cost-effective publishing activities (recommendation 17), that did not necessarily imply the need for a self-supporting publications fund or account. That issue should be considered carefully by Member States and could be better dealt with in the Fifth Committee.

125. With regard to recommendation 6, the Inspectors wished to emphasize the potential role of the Dag Hammarskjöld Library in screening publications before programme budgets were prepared. Concern was expressed that the recommendation did not specify how the criteria for screening proposed publications (relevance to mandates, usefulness for implementing mandates and potential for duplication) were related to one another and to publications policy. It was stated that the report presented an accurate picture of the current administrative, managerial and organizational arrangements in place in the Secretariat.

126. The Joint Inspection Unit hoped that if the recommendations were accepted in principle, a number of elements, such as electronic publishing, could be added to existing publications policies and the whole spectrum of policies could be reviewed in the future by the Fifth Committee.

#### Conclusions and recommendations

127. The Committee on Conferences took note with appreciation of the well-researched report of the Joint Inspection Unit. The Committee, aware that the customary comments of the Secretary-General on the report were not yet before it, decided to limit its endorsement to those recommendations that were addressed directly to substantive legislative bodies (recommendations 1, 2, 5 and 9). Input from users utilizing the opportunities provided by modern technology might be useful in evaluating future publications programmes.

III. REVIEW OF THE PROPOSED PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE  
BIENNIUM 1998-1999: CONFERENCE SERVICES

Introduction and overview

128. At its 327th meeting, on 12 June 1991, the Committee on Conferences decided to review the relevant programme narrative of the proposed programme budget for conference services and to provide its views thereon to the General Assembly.

129. In the light of that decision, the Secretariat submitted to the Committee for its consideration, at its 402nd meeting, on 26 August 1997, the relevant programme narrative of the proposed programme budget for conference services for the biennium 1998-1999 (A/52/6 (Sect. 27E)).

Conclusions and recommendations

130. The Committee decided to defer consideration of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1998-1999 to a resumed session, to be held after it received the revised proposals relating to conference services of the proposed programme budget. (The report of the Committee on this question will be issued as an addendum to the present report.)

#### IV. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

##### A. Membership

131. The General Assembly, in resolution 43/222 B of 21 December 1988, had decided to retain the Committee on Conferences as a permanent subsidiary organ. Pursuant to that resolution, the Committee in 1997 was composed of the following Member States: Austria, Bahamas, Belgium, Chile, Fiji, France, Gabon, Ghana, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Latvia, Morocco, Namibia, Nepal, Russian Federation, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Senegal and United States of America.

##### B. Officers

132. The Committee elected the following officers to serve in 1997:

Chairman: Mr. Uldis Blukis (Latvia)

Vice-Chairmen: Mr. Thomas Schlesinger (Austria)  
Mrs. Sheila Sealy Monteith (Jamaica)  
Mr. Morteza Mirmohammad (Islamic Republic of Iran)

133. At its organizational session for 1997 (397th meeting), on 1 April 1997, the Committee agreed in principle that the Chairman would undertake informal consultations with a view to determining the composition of the Committee's Bureau in 1998.

##### C. Organization of work

134. At its 397th meeting, the Committee agreed to meet as required to take up matters related to the calendar of conferences and its implementation, in particular the consideration of inter-sessional departures from the approved calendar. At the same meeting, the Committee requested the Secretariat to submit a draft agenda for 1998 at the organizational session to be held early in 1998. The Committee met on 16 June 1997 (398th meeting) to consider the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings of subsidiary organs of the Economic and Social Council for 1998-1999. The Committee convened its substantive session on 25, 26 and 28 August 1997 (399th to 403rd meetings).

##### D. Programme of work

135. At its organizational session for 1996, on 1 February 1996, the Committee had requested the Secretariat to submit to it, at its organizational session for 1997, a draft agenda for 1997, which was subsequently issued in document A/AC.172/1997/L.1 and adopted by the Committee (A/AC.172/1997/1).

136. The Director of Conference Services and the Under-Secretary-General for General Assembly Affairs and Conference Services, respectively, addressed the Committee at the opening of its organizational and substantive sessions.

137. At an informal video-meeting, on 26 August 1997, the members of the Committee held simultaneous consultations with Conference Services at Headquarters, Geneva, Vienna and Nairobi.



V. WORK OF THE COMMITTEE DURING THE FIFTY-FIRST SESSION  
OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, FROM 17 SEPTEMBER TO  
20 DECEMBER 1996

138. The Committee on Conferences convened its 396th meeting on 19 September 1996, pursuant to a request made at the 391st meeting that the Secretariat should submit a report on all bodies that have a general waiver to meet away from their established headquarters, thus constituting a departure from General Assembly resolution 40/243 of 18 December 1985, to be reviewed by the Committee during the main part of the fifty-first session of the General Assembly. The deliberations of the Committee on the matter are reflected in its report to the General Assembly at its fifty-first session.<sup>4</sup>

139. In addition, the Committee was seized with the following request:
