## Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11593 of 7 January 1975 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 22 February 1975, the Security Council took action on the following item:

89. The situation in Cyprus (see S/11185/Add.28, S/11185/Add.29, S/11185/Add.32, S/11185/Add.34 and S/11185/Add.49).

The Security Council continued its consideration of the item at its 1813th and 1814th meetings, held on 20 and 21 February 1975, and included in its agenda a letter dated 17 February 1975 from the Permanent Representatives of Cyprus addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/11625) containing a request to convene an urgent meeting of the Security Council.

At the 1813th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Cyprus, Greece and Turkey, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote. The Council also decided to extend an invitation, under rule 39 of the provisional rules of procedure, to Mr. Vedat A. Çelik.
