SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11593 of 7 January 1975 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 22 November 1975, the Security Council took no action on any of the items listed therein.

During that week, however, the Security Council, at its 1855th meeting on 17 November, proceeded to the election of five members of the International Court of Justice. In the course of the voting, the following five candidates received the required majority of votes in the Security Council: Mr. Taslim Olawale Elias (Nigeria), Mr. Manfred Lachs (Poland), Mr. Hermann Mosler (Federal Republic of Germany), Mr. Shigeru Oda (Japan) and Mr. Salah El Dine Tarazi (Syrian Arab Republic).

As the same five candidates received the required majority of votes in the General Assembly, they were declared elected members of the International Court of Justice for a nine-year term of office beginning 6 February 1976.
