ANNEX

Permanent Mission of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania to the United Nations

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the King of Morocco, pursuing an increasingly dangerous course, is endeavouring at all costs to implicate Mauritania in the attacks to which he is being subjected in Western Sahara.

I can assure you, Sir, that these attacks do not originate in our territory and that no foreign troops retreated to our territory after the fighting which took place last week in the vicinity of Gueltat Zemmour. I request you to use your influence with the King of Morocco in order to dissuade him from carrying out rash and unjustified acts against our country and people.

In any case, our people will be obliged to ensure by all means the legitimate defence of its sovereignty and territorial integrity against any Moroccan aggression, for which the King of Morocco, Hassan II, alone will bear full and complete responsibility.

Accept, Sir, the assurances of my highest consideration.
