GENERAL AND COMPLETE DISARMAMENT

<u>Costa Rica, Egypt, Nigeria and Saudi Arabia:</u> <u>revised draft resolution</u>

Transparency in armaments

The General Assembly,

Recalling its earlier resolutions on transparency in armaments,

<u>Continuing to hold the view</u> that an enhanced level of transparency in all types of armaments contributes greatly to confidence-building and security among States,

Taking duly into account the relationship between transparency and the security needs of all States at the regional and international levels,

<u>Recognizing</u> that, notwithstanding the fact that the United Nations Register of Conventional Arms¹ in its current form deals with seven categories of conventional weapons, the principle of transparency should also apply to weapons of mass destruction and to transfers of equipment and technologies directly related to the development and manufacture of such weapons,

<u>Convinced</u> that an enhanced level of transparency in weapons of mass destruction and transfers of equipment and technologies directly related to the development and manufacture of such weapons could serve as a catalyst towards general and complete disarmament,

Stressing the need to achieve universality of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, the Chemical Weapons Convention and the Biological Weapons Convention as well as other instruments related to transfers of equipment and technologies directly related to the development and manufacture of such weapons, with a view to realizing the goal of the total elimination of all weapons of mass destruction,

1. Takes note of the reports of the Secretary-General on transparency in armaments; $^{\rm 2}$

2. <u>Reaffirms</u> its conviction of the interrelationship between transparency in the field of conventional weapons and transparency in the fields of weapons of mass destruction and transfers of equipment and technologies directly related to the development and manufacture of such weapons;

3. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to seek the views of Member States on ways and means of enhancing transparency in the fields of weapons of mass destruction and transfers of equipment and technologies directly related to the development and manufacture of such weapons with a view to enhancing transparency in the field of conventional weapons and to include in his report to the General Assembly at its fifty-third session a special section on the implementation of the present resolution;

4. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-third session the item entitled "Transparency in armaments".
