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SECURITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO RESOLUTION 864 (1993) CONCERNING THE SITUATION IN ANGOLA

NOTE VERBALE DATED 3 DECEMBER 1997 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF MONACO TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE

The Permanent Representative of the Principality of Monaco to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 864 (1993) concerning the situation in Angola and, with reference to his note verbale of 4 November 1997, has the honour to inform him that the Government of the Principality has been seized of the text of Security Council resolution 1135 (1997) of 29 October 1997 concerning the situation in Angola, and has taken the necessary measures to comply with the provisions mentioned in paragraph 4 of resolution 1127 (1997).

All the necessary instructions have been issued to the relevant Monegasque authorities to prevent, taking account of bilateral international agreements which have been reached, the entry into or transit through Monegasque territory of leaders of the União Nacional para a Independência Total de Angola (UNITA), or of adult members of their immediate families.

No travel document, visa or residence permit has ever been issued to the above-mentioned persons. No UNITA office has been established in Monaco.

The relevant services have also been instructed to prevent flights by UNITA aircraft and - an unlikely eventuality - to deny permission to any aircraft to take off from, land in, or overfly Monegasque territory if it has taken off from or is destined to land at a place in the territory of Angola other than one on a list supplied by the Government of Angola.

The Government of the Principality also intends to use every means at its disposal to ensure that all the prohibitions stipulated in paragraph 4 (d), subparagraphs (ii) and (iii), of resolution 1127 (1997) are complied with.

This note constitutes the reply to the request addressed to Member States in paragraph 13 of the same resolution.
