Spain currently included 19 autonomous communities since the approval, on 13 March 1995, of the Statutes of Autonomy of Ceuta and Melilla. As indicated in paragraph 11 of the report, under article 149, paragraph 3, of the Constitution, matters not expressly assigned to the State by the Constitution might fall under the jurisdiction of the autonomous communities by virtue of their respective Statutes. It must not be forgotten, however, that article 149, paragraph 3, also stipulated that powers not assumed by the autonomous communities were automatically exercised by the State, whose laws would take precedence, in case of conflict, over those of the autonomous communities.
