RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

STATUS OF THE CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

Report of the Secretary-General

1. The General Assembly, in its resolution 44/25 of 20 November 1989, adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child and expressed the hope that it would come into force at an early date. The Convention was opened for signature in New York on 26 January 1990 and, in accordance with article 49 thereof, entered into force on 2 September 1990, on the thirtieth day after the date of the deposit with the Secretary-General of the United Nations of the twentieth instrument of ratification or accession.

In its resolution 1997/78 I of 18 April 1997, the Commission on Human 2. Rights welcomed the nearly universal ratification of the Convention and urged once again those States that had not done so to sign and ratify or accede to the Convention as a matter of priority; welcomed the constructive role of the Committee on the Rights of the Child in creating awareness of the principles and provisions of the Convention and in providing recommendations to States parties on its implementation; called upon States parties to withdraw reservations incompatible with the object and purpose of the Convention and consider reviewing other reservations and to accept the amendment which would increase the membership of the Committee from 10 to 18 experts; and decided to encourage the Committee to continue to pay attention to the needs of children in especially difficult circumstances, including children with disabilities. In resolution 1997/78 II the Commission called upon all States to take all necessary measures to ensure the full and equal enjoyment by girls of all human rights and fundamental freedoms, and to eliminate all forms of discrimination against girls and the root causes of son preference. The Commission, in resolution 1997/78 III, welcomed the report of the Special Rapporteur on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography

and the adoption and dissemination of the Declaration and Agenda for Action of the World Congress against Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children, called upon all States to cooperate with and assist the Special Rapporteur and to participate constructively in the negotiations on an optional protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on the sale of children, child prostitution and child pornography with the aim of an early agreement on the text and invited the Committee to offer comments on the draft optional protocol and to consider being represented at the next session of the working group on the question of the draft optional protocol. In resolution 1997/78 IV the Commission welcomed the final report of the expert appointed by the Secretary-General to undertake a study on the impact of armed conflict on children and the recommendation by the General Assembly to the Secretary-General to appoint a special representative on this question; called upon all States to participate constructively in the negotiations on an optional protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on the involvement of children in armed conflicts with the aim of an early agreement on the text and invited the Committee to offer comments on the draft optional protocol and to consider being represented at the next session of the working group on the question of the draft optional protocol, and to contribute on an ongoing basis to international mine-clearance efforts; and decided to invite Member States, United Nations organs and bodies, the International Committee of the Red Cross as well as other relevant organizations to contribute to the work of the special representative of the Secretary-general on the impact of armed conflict on children. In resolution 1997/78 V the Commission called upon all states to protect refugee and internally displaced children. In resolution 1997/78 VI the Commission welcomed the measures taken by Governments to eliminate the exploitation of child labour, the initiatives to convene international conferences on various forms of child labour, and the efforts by the Committee on the Rights of the Child in the area of child labour; and called upon all States to translate into concrete action their commitment to the progressive and effective elimination of all forms of exploitative child labour and to support the proposed drafting by the International Labour Organization of an instrument aimed at eradicating the most intolerable forms of child labour. In resolution 1997/78 VII the Commission called upon all States to continue actively to seek comprehensive solutions to the problems of children on the street. In resolution 1997/78 VIII the Commission requested the Secretary-General to submit to the Commission at its fifty-fourth session a report on the status of the Convention on the Rights of the Child.

3. As at 30 November 1997 the Convention had received 140 signatures which were followed by ratification. In addition, 45 States had acceded to the Convention and 6 had succeeded to it, bringing the total of ratifications and accessions to the Convention to 191. A list of States that have ratified or acceded to the Convention, and the dates of their signature, ratification or accession, appears in the annex to the present report.

4. The Committee on the Rights of the Child held its eleventh session from 8 to 26 January 1996 at the United Nations Office at Geneva. At that session the Committee considered reports submitted by seven States parties to the Convention. In addition, the Committee reviewed its cooperation with United Nations bodies in connection with the consideration of two draft optional protocols to the Convention. The Committee adopted a report on its eleventh session (CRC/C/50) as well as its biennial report to the General Assembly (A/51/41).

5. The Committee on the Rights of the Child held its fifteenth session from 20 May to 6 June 1997 at the United Nations Office at Geneva. During that session, the Committee considered reports submitted by six States parties to the Convention. In addition, the Committee reviewed its cooperation with the United Nations and other competent bodies. The Committee adopted a report on its fifteenth session (CRC/C/66).

6. The Committee on the Rights of the Child held its sixteenth session at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 22 September to 10 October 1997. During that session the Committee considered six States parties reports submitted under the Convention. One day was devoted to a general discussion on the topic "The rights of children with disabilities". The thematic discussion was organized around three main topics: the rights of children with disabilities to life and development; self-representation and participation of children with disabilities; and the entitlement of such children to inclusive education. The Committee adopted the report of the thirteenth session (CRC/C/69).

7. The seventeenth session of the Committee on the Rights of the Child will be held from 5 to 23 January 1998 at Geneva.

8. The sixth Meeting of the States parties to the Convention was convened by the Secretary-General at United Nations Headquarters on 18 February 1997 for the purpose of electing five members of the Committee on the Rights of the Child to replace those whose terms were due to expire on 28 February 1997.
