SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

<u>Addendum</u>

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1997/40 of 10 January 1997, S/1997/40/Add.10 of 21 March 1997, S/1997/40/Add.20 of 30 May 1997 and S/1997/40/Add.21 of 6 June 1997.

During the week ending 19 July 1997, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation in Croatia (see S/25070/Add.37; S/1995/40/Add.5, 16, 17, 19, 23, 30, 31, 35, 39, 46 and 50; and S/1996/15/Add.1, 2, 4, 7, 20, 26, 28, 30, 32, 45 and 50; and S/1997/40/Add.2, 4, 9, 11, 16 and 18; see also S/22110/Add.38, 47 and 50; S/23370/Add.1, 5, 7, 14, 16, 19, 21, 23, 24, 26, 28, 29, 31, 32, 35-37, 40, 43, 45, 46, 49 and 50; S/25070/Add.1, 4, 7-9, 11-13, 15-19, 21-23, 24 and Corr.1, 26, 28-30, 32-34, 37, 39-42 and 45; S/1994/20 and Add.4, 6, 8, 10, 12-17, 20, 21, 23, 25, 26, 31, 34, 37, 38, 44-47 and 49; S/1995/40 and Add.1, 2, 6, 12, 14, 15, 18, 24, 26-29, 32, 36, 37, 40, 44 and 47-50; and S/1996/15/Add.6, 8, 13, 18, 21, 31, 37, 39, 40, 47 and 49; and S/1997/40/Add.6, 10, 12, 14, 19, 21 and 23)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3800th meeting, held on 14 July 1997 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the reports of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission of Observers in Prevlaka (S/1997/506) and on the situation in Croatia (S/1997/487).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Belgium, Croatia, Germany and Italy, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/537) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations, and

to the text of a draft resolution (S/1997/538) that had been submitted by Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Portugal, the Russian Federation, Sweden, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America, subsequently joined by the Republic of Korea.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/537, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1119 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1119 (1997); to be issued in <u>Official Records of the Security Council</u>, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and <u>Decisions of the Security Council</u>, 1997).

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1997/538, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1120 (1997) (for the text, see S/RES/1120 (1997); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).

<u>Civilian police in peacekeeping operations</u> (<u>see also</u> S/25070/Add.13 and 39; and S/1997/40/Add.10)

The Security Council met to consider the item at its 3801st meeting, held on 14 July 1997 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/1997/38; to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-second Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1997).
