## <u>Annex</u>

Statement issued on 7 January 1998 by the Presidency of the European Union on the massacre of civilians at Rukaramu, Burundi

The European Union condemns in the strongest possible terms the attack on the village of Rukaramu, near Bujumbura. It deplores this barbaric attack which resulted in very heavy civilian casualties, including a large number of deaths.

The European Union fully supports the efforts of the United Nations Human Rights Field Operation in Burundi to investigate the massacre and looks forward to an early, independent assessment by the Operation.

The European Union urges all parties fully to respect human rights, to engage in a dialogue with a view to promoting reconciliation and bringing to an end the political problems of Burundi, so that all the people of Burundi may build a peaceful, prosperous and secure future.
