THE SITUATION IN KAMPUCHEA

Administrative implications of the draft resolution  
contained in document A/36/L.3/Rev.1

Observations by the Committee on Conferences in accordance  
with paragraph 6 of General Assembly resolution 35/10 A

1. In accordance with paragraph 6 of resolution 35/10 A, by which the General Assembly had decided that all proposals affecting the schedule of conferences and meetings made at sessions of the General Assembly shall be reviewed by the Committee on Conferences when administrative implications are being considered under the requirements of rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the Assembly, the Committee on Conferences met to review the implications of the draft resolution contained in document A/36/L.3/Rev.1, in particular paragraphs 3, 4, 5 and 9.
2. In the course of the discussion on the arrangements for the International Conference on Kampuchea, the majority of delegations indicated that they supported the provision of services to the Conference and the Ad Hoc Committee. The delegations of Hungary and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics stated that in the view of their delegations no services and facilities should be provided by the United Nations for the Conference and the Ad Hoc Committee. The Committee noted the proposed servicing arrangements, as set out in document A/C.5/36/18, but observed that in the light of the experience gained during the first session of the Conference, a better utilization of conference resources could be achieved.
3. In view of the undetermined venue and dates of the proposed meeting, the Committee on Conferences wishes to point out that any future scheduling involving Headquarters, might have to take account of the holding of the Second Special Session of the General Assembly Devoted to Disarmament, the Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea and the thirty-seventh regular session of the General Assembly so as to avoid overlaps and competing demands for limited facilities and services.
