COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS Fifty-fourth session Agenda item 5

QUESTION OF THE REALIZATION IN ALL COUNTRIES OF THE ECONOMIC, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL RIGHTS CONTAINED IN THE UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND IN THE INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON ECONOMIC, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL RIGHTS, AND STUDY OF SPECIAL PROBLEMS WHICH THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES FACE IN THEIR EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE THESE HUMAN RIGHTS

Administrative and programme budget implications of the draft resolution contained in document E/CN.4/1998/L.35 entitled "Question of the realization in all countries of the economic, social and cultural rights contained in the Universal Declaration of Human rights and in the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, and study of special problems which the developing countries face in their efforts to achieve these human rights

### A. Request contained in the resolution

- 1. Under the terms of paragraph 6 of draft resolution E/CN.4/1998/L.35, the Commission would decide as part of its efforts to impart a higher visibility to economic, social and cultural rights, to appoint, for a period of three years, a special rapporteur whose mandate will focus on the right to education.
- 2. In paragraph 7 of the same resolution, the Secretary-General is requested to provide the Special Rapporteur with all the assistance necessary for the execution of the mandate.

# B. Relationship of request to the programme of work

3. The above-mentioned activity falls under programme 19 (Human Rights), subprogramme 3 (Advisory services, technical cooperation, support to human rights fact-finding procedures and field activities) of the medium-term plan for the period 1998-2001 (A/51/6/Rev.1).

4. It also falls under subprogramme 3 (Advisory services, technical cooperation, support to human rights fact-finding procedures and field activities) of Section 22 (Human Rights) of the programme budget for the biennium 1998-1999. It will fall under the same subprogramme in the proposed programme budget for 2000-2001.

#### C. Activities by which the request would be implemented

- 5. During the course of 1998, the Special Rapporteur would undertake one trip to Geneva, for a period of three working days, to hold consultations at the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and review documentation, to meet representatives of Governments as well as of intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations.
- 6. In 1998, the Special Rapporteur, accompanied by an OHCHR staff member, would undertake one visit to the field for a period of five working days.
- 7. In 1999, 2000 and 2001, the Special Rapporteur would undertake one mission to Geneva and one mission to the field, of the same duration as in 1998.
- 8. The substantive servicing of the Special Rapporteur would involve the work of one Professional Officer at the P-3 level for a period of four months in 1998/1999 and two months in 2000.

### D. Modification of the programme of work

9. The description of the programme of work under subprogramme 3 of Section 22 of the programme budget for 1998-1999 would be modified through the addition of a reference to a thematic mandate on the right to education, and to the preparation and processing of the related reports, under paragraphs 22.55 and 22.57 (ii) of the programme budget for the biennium 1998-1999. The same reference would be included in the proposed programme budget for 2000-2001.

## E. Additional requirements at full cost

10. The preliminary estimated full cost of the above activity is itemized as follows:
