ANNEX

Statement issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine on 12 May 1998

On 11 May 1998, India conducted three underground nuclear tests.

This event has aroused profound concern in Ukraine as it undermines the moratorium on nuclear testing which the States of the world have been observing for a long time.

Our State, whose people have experienced the terrible consequences of radiation exposure, believes that none of the defence or security considerations of any country can justify the resumption of nuclear testing.

Ukraine, which voluntarily renounced it arsenal - the world's third largest - of nuclear weapons and refrained from nuclear testing, condemns this act of India which constitutes a threat to existing international agreements in the field of non-proliferation of nuclear weapons.

Ukraine calls upon the Governments of India and other States to cooperate more actively in the field of the peaceful uses of nuclear energy and towards the final prohibition of nuclear weapons.
