Statement by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic
of Kazakhstan, Kasymjomart Tokaev, of 28 May 1998

The nuclear-weapon tests conducted by Pakistan represent an escalation in tension not only in the region, but also on a global scale.

It is to be noted with profound regret that India and Pakistan, carried away by nuclear ambitions, have seriously impaired international security. The actions by these countries are eroding the basis for the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons.

Kazakhstan firmly opposes the proliferation of nuclear weapons and urges all States to act responsibly and with restraint.

The leaders of Kazakhstan believe that India and Pakistan must accede to the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty.
