THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FUND PROGRAMME IN 1980 AND 1981

Note by the Executive Director

The present document covers developments in the Environment Fund between I January and 30 April 1981.

A. APPROPRIATION, APPORTIONMENT AND ALLOCATION

1. No change has yet been made in the allocations for Fund programme activities described in paragraph 2 of UNEP/GC.9/9 and set out in table 1 of that document.

B. PROJECT COMMITMENTS

2. Compared with 31 December 1980, the total project commitments as at 30 April 1981 were as follows:

The net increase in project commitments incurred since 31 December 1980 amounts therefore to \$6.1 million (of which \$3.1 million in non-convertible currencies), but it should be noted that, unlike the figures at 31 December 1980, those of 30 April 1981 include projects accepted by UNEP but not yet formally approved by a signature on behalf of the Fund on a project document owing to normal delays in the return to Nairobi of project documents signed by the implementing agencies. A list of projects formally approved by the signature of the Fund in the period I January 1981 to 30 April 1981 is annexed to the present note.

3. Compared with 31 December 1980, total non-convertible currency project commitments as at 30 April 1981 were as follows:

C. PROJECT EXPENDITURES

4. The finalization of the interim accounts for 1980 shows that project expenditures in that year were \$26.8 million, or rather higher than the estimate of \$25 million given in document UNEP/GC.9/9. Expenditure as a proportion of project commitments as at 31 December 1980 was therefore 83.5 per cent, and as a proportion of allocations 74.0 per cent, rather higher in both cases than the figures shown in table 2 of document UNEP/GC.9/9. Details of project expenditures by budget line are given in the table on page below.

5. Of the total project expenditure of \$26.8 million, \$5.5 million, or 20.4 per cent, was in non-convertible currency. In addition, some \$0.3 million was reimbursed in dollars from the non-convertible currency balances in respect of expenditures relating to programme and programme support costs. Total use of these currencies in respect of 1980 expenditures was thus \$5.8 million. In addition, approximately \$0.5 million in non-convertible currencies was used to pay obligations incurred in earlier years.
