### **Statement on Myanmar issued on 11 September 1998 by the Presidency on behalf of the European Union**

The European Union condemns the detention by the authorities of Myanmar of over 100 opposition activists, including over 60 members of Parliament-elect from the National League for Democracy and from ethnic minority parties such as the Shan Nationalities League for Democracy.

The European Union considers this to be an unacceptable violation of their freedom and a step away from democracy.

The European Union calls for an immediate release of all political detainees in Myanmar and for the authorities of Myanmar urgently to enter into a substantive dialogue with opposition parties and to respect the 1990 general election results.

The central and eastern European countries associated with the European Union, the associated country Cyprus and the European Free Trade Association countries members of the European Economic Area align themselves with the present statement.
