1. At its 32nd meeting, on 5 November 1981, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/36/27) on the administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 12 of its report (A/36/649). The observations of the Committee on Conferences, made in accordance with General Assembly resolution 35/10 A, are contained in document A/C.6/36/L.4/Add.1. The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative Budgetary Questions were presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/36/SR.32).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided without objection to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt the draft resolution recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 12 of its report (A/36/649), additional conference servicing costs not

exceeding \$565,400 would arise, which would be considered at a later stage in the context of the consolidated statement of conference servicing costs for 1982.

4. Statements in explanation of position were made by the representatives of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, France, Belgium, the Federal Republic of Germany, Italy, Greece, Canada, Japan and China.
