CONCERNING THE SITUATION IN ANGOLA

NOTE VERBALE DATED 6 OCTOBER 1998 FROM THE CHARGÉ D'AFFAIRES A.I.
OF OMAN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE CHAIRMAN OF
THE COMMITTEE

The Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Sultanate of Oman to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 864 (1993) concerning the situation in Angola and has the honour to refer to the latter's note dated 21 July 1998.

The Government of the Sultanate of Oman, in compliance with Security Council resolution 1173 (1998) of 12 June 1998, will abide by the provisions of paragraphs 11 and 12 of that resolution.

Accordingly, the Oman Royal Police and the Ministry of Commerce and Industry of the Sultanate of Oman have been identified as the two legislative authorities to deal and coordinate with export and import matters (to and from Angola), including precious minerals. Necessary measures will also be taken to discontinue all transactions with persons or entities of the União Nacional para a Independência Total de Angola (UNITA) and other regions outside the control of the coalition Government relating to the mining industry. Moreover, instructions will be issued to the Central Bank of Oman and other private financial institutions in the Sultanate of Oman to freeze the assets of UNITA as an organization, of senior officials of UNITA and of adult members of their immediate family, in accordance with resolution 1173 (1998), and in cooperation and coordination with the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 864 (1993).
