United Nations programme of fellowships on disarmament

The General Assembly,

<u>Recalling</u> its decision, taken at the tenth special session, to establish a programme of fellowships on disarmament, $\underline{1}/$

<u>Recalling also</u> its resolution 35/152 A of 12 December 1980, in which it requested the Secretary-General to make adequate arrangements relating to the programme for 1981 in accordance with the guidelines approved by the General Assembly at its thirty-third session,

Expressing its satisfaction at the fact that Governments, particularly those of developing countries, have continued to manifest serious interest in the programme,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Secretary-General on the implementation of the United Nations programme of fellowships on disarmament for 1981, 2/

2. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to make adequate arrangements relating to the programme for 1982 in accordance with the guidelines approved by the General Assembly at its thirty-third session;

3. <u>Also requests</u> the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly at its second special session devoted to disarmament a report entitled "Assessment of the United Nations programme of fellowships on disarmament since its inception in 1979";

4. <u>Commends</u> the Secretary-General for the diligence with which the programme has been conducted;

5. <u>Expresses its appreciation</u> to the Governments of the Federal Republic of Germany, Hungary and Sweden for inviting the Fellows to their capitals to study selected activities in the field of disarmament, thereby contributing to the fulfillment of the over-all objectives of the programme, as well as providing additional information sources and practical knowledge for the Fellows.
