Consultants and individual contractors

Report of the Secretary-General

1. By paragraph 7 of section VI of its resolution 51/226 of 3 April 1997, the General Assembly endorsed the recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions that the Secretariat resume the past practice of submitting, on a biennial basis and in conjunction with the report requested by the Committee on the hiring of retired staff, a report on the hiring and use of consultants, following the format of past reports on the subject (A/51/533, para. 44).
2. With release 3 of the Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) in April 1996, statistical data on consultants and individual contractors engaged at United Nations Headquarters are available as a consequence of the recording of contractual obligations and payments. This facility, is not yet available, however, at all offices away from Headquarters. The statistics in the annex to the present report, therefore, reflect data on expenditures at offices away from Headquarters collected in a standard format and integrated into the IMIS database. For the first time, global summaries and statistics are available, based on an aggregation of comparable detailed data sets.
3. In the biennium 1996–1997, 7,505 individual special service agreements were concluded with consultants or individual contractors, for a total contract duration of 1,697 person years of work. Total expenditure for these special service agreements was \$53 million, from all sources of funding; 72 per cent of special service agreements for consultants and individual contractors were at offices away from Headquarters. Consultants comprised 80 per cent of all persons contracted under special service agreements. Consultants and individual contractors engaged during the biennium, 1996–1997 were drawn from 165 countries and areas (162 Member States, Switzerland, Tonga and Palestinian). With regard to gender, 28 per cent of those engaged were women. Expenditure recorded against the regular budget for 1996–1997 for consultants and individual contractors totalled \$11.3 million, including travel and subsistence, compared with an allotment of \$11.9 million; the regular budget covered 26 per cent of total engagements. Some 235 special service



agreements (3 per cent of the total) were concluded with 94 retirees from the United Nations common system, representing \$1.1 million in expenditure.

4. Table 1 of the annex presents data on the engagement of consultants and individual contractors by department or office for 1996–1997. The secretariat of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development accounted for 20 per cent of all engagements, the Department for Development Support and Management Services for 10 per cent and Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean for 16 per cent. The table shows details of the number of special service agreements, the number of contractees, the number of days worked and total fees.

5. Table 2 breaks down the same data by department or office for the biennium with regard to the average number of days per contractee, the average fee per contractee and the resultant average fee per day.

6. Table 3 presents data on the use of consultants and individual contractors by nationality, again with a breakdown of the number special service agreements, the number of contractees, the number of days worked and total fees.
